September 2022

Dear Parents / Carers

Welcome to our first Newsletter of the year and it has been great to have all of our students back on campus. We have seen a really positive start to the new term and I have been really delighted to see that students have already achieved close to 10,000 achievement points. This year we have launched our new daily Tutor Time Reading Programme and all students across the campus will read a carefully chosen selection of books as they progress through the school. The clear aim with this programme is to improve outcomes, through more fluent readers, with increased vocabulary and the ability to confidently access all text types. We also hope that the programme opens our students' eyes to the rich world of literature that exists and ignites a lifelong passion to read for pleasure too.

BGLC continues to be a popular choice in the community with 250 students enrolling and a significant waiting list of families wanting a place at our school.

We were very pleased with the academic success of our students at both GCSE and A Level this year after the challenges of the pandemic, we are confident that results will improve further in the coming years and the foundations have been securely laid for the year ahead. It was a real privilege to welcome students back onto campus to celebrate their success in our recent Annual Awards Evening that recognised the amazingly talented students we have across our campus. We continue to focus heavily on improving the culture across our campus and our wildly important goal for the year is to "Consistently embed a culture of kindness and excellence across our campus". 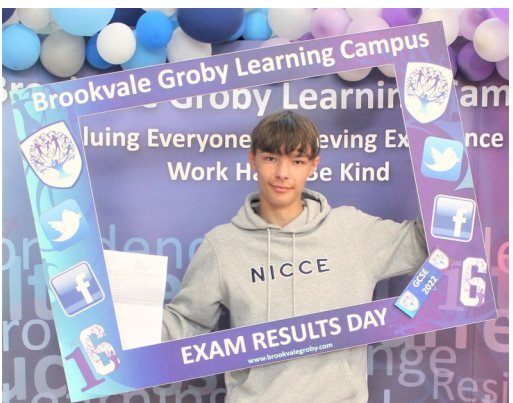
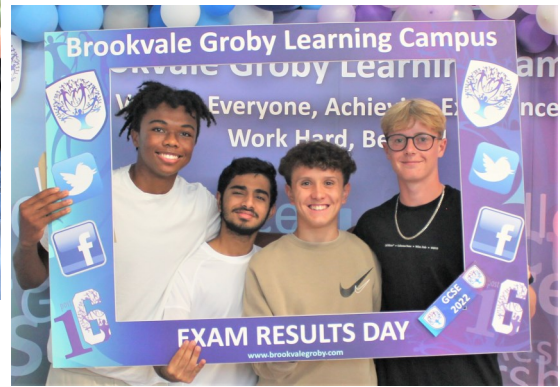
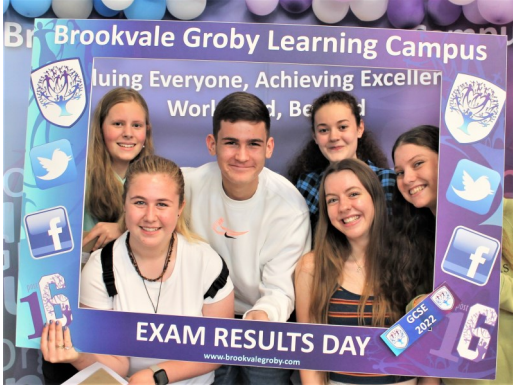

NORMANDY 2022 RESIDENTIAL TRIP

This September we were able to run our first trip to Normandy for 3 years.

As usual we had a dual focus of French and History. We practiced our reading and speaking of French in a number of different towns including Honfleur, Bayeux and Arromanches. We learnt a little of French culture on our visit to a goat farm.

We visited Falaise castle, home of William the Conqueror, and saw the world-famous Bayeux Tapestry.

We also visited a number of sites linked to the D-Day landings of 1944 and held our usual act of remembrance in the British War Cemetery in Bayeux. Our students were complimented on several occasions by members of the public about their excellent behaviour.

In the evenings we visited the beach, played ball games outside our hotel and on the final evening we held a memorable team competition, comprising of physical challenges and quizzes about what we had learnt.



In total 68 students and 6 staff made the journey, and along with everything that we all learned, we all came back knowing some people, who we had not known well before, a whole lot better, which is always one of the great benefits of a residential trip.

As many of you will know we were victims of an unpleasant accident, but especially at that difficult time, every single one of the young people on the visit was a credit to the school and their families. I was proud to be with them. I am pleased to say that those most directly affected continue to recover well.

We'd like to start by saying a massive "Well done!" to all of our Year 7 students who have settled into their maths lessons fabulously. We have been impressed by what you have shown us so far and look forward to seeing what you can do in your time with us. A reminder that you are expected to have the following equipment with you for all maths lessons; pen, pencil, ruler, calculator. We recommend the Casio ClassWiz calculator if you haven't already got one. It would be really useful if you also had a protractor and a pair of compasses.



This academic year we are once again using Hegarty Maths to support the independent learning of our students. Students will be set weekly homework tasks to complete on Hegarty Maths to reinforce the learning in the classroom but it doesn't have to stop there. With a student login you are able to work through as many tasks as you like as often as you like. So if students are finding a topic tricky, missed a lesson or just want to do some extra revision or practice, this is a great resource to use.

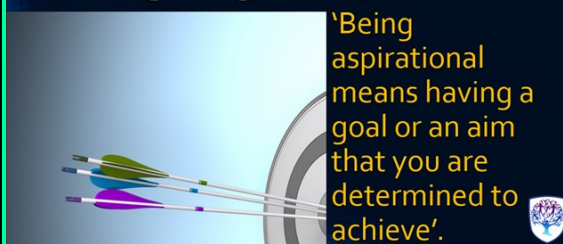

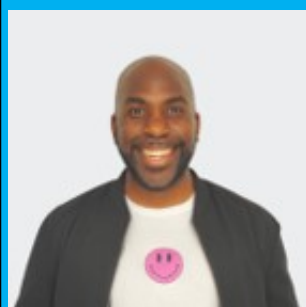
KS3 PROGRESS

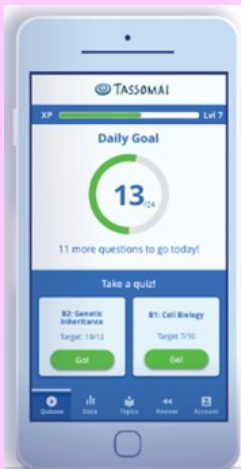

SAFEGUARDING INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

As a campus we give the highest priority to safeguarding our children and young people in all aspects of their school and campus lives. This means that staff and volunteers must be alert to possible concerns about every student, and to report these in a proper fashion. The campus has a safeguarding and child protection policy which parents/carers can view on our website;

www.brookvalegroby.com

In order to effectively safeguard all students and adults on site it is important that all visitors to school, including parents and carers, sign in at reception before they go anywhere else. All adults on the campus are asked to challenge any adults that they see on site who are not wearing identification which indicates that they have signed in at reception. Please do not go directly to the Groby building or any other part of the campus without first going to reception in the Brookvale building.

It is important for parents to be aware that:

- Staff and volunteers in the campus have a duty to report concerns about a child, whether this means the child may be in need of additional support or help of some kind or whether it is thought that a child may have been abused or be at risk of abuse.
- In some cases the campus is obliged to refer children to children's social care staff, for children to be assessed for their needs or if an investigation into possible child abuse is required.
- In many cases there will already have been discussions between campus staff and the parents of the child, and the situation and concerns will not be a surprise to the parents. However, parents may not be told that the campus has referred their child to children's social care if it is thought that this might put the child at risk.
- Children's social care tries to carry out its enquiries in a sensitive fashion. It has to gather information and generally it can be open with parents about the steps being taken.
- If you think your child may have been abused, or may be at risk, you should contact the children's social care office. If you think the abuse may have happened on campus, contact the Headteacher or the Designated Senior Person for Child Protection, who is Mr Godwin, Senior Deputy Headteacher. If you think your child has been hurt, arrange to visit your doctor. Comfort and reassure your child.

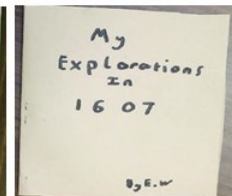
Dancing with the Devil

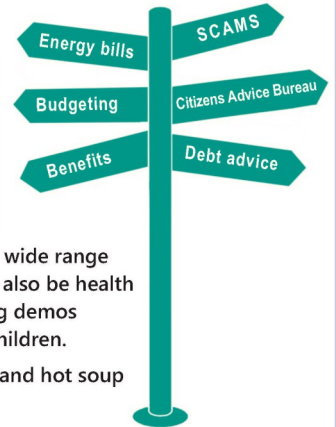

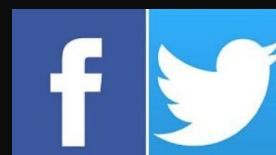
