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- Illnesses are inevitable throughout the school year and there are times when school will need to contact parents to collect their child. However, we are starting to see a number of students regularly presenting at the office saying they feel unwell and asking to go home. Whilst we do take students at their word, we do assess the students and try to encourage students back to their lessons where possible. It is important that parents and students are aware of the following:
 - For Safeguarding reasons, students must <u>not</u> contact home directly when they feel unwell. If your child contacts you, please ask them to present themselves to reception.
 - Students may carry one dose of pain relief during the school day. We cannot give out pain relief tablets.
 - Academic progression is affected when students go home regularly and we would appreciate your support in trying to keep them on campus if able.
 - If your child has an update to an already existing medical condition, or they are newly diagnosed, please contact Reception ASAP so we know how best to support them.
- Replacement ID cards the £5 payment can now be made online via the Arbor School Shop.
- School Bus payments a reminder that bus instalments (with the exception of students in Year 7 and new students to school), which became available during the Summer Term 2022, are still available to be paid on Weduc, the previous payments system.
