HEADTEACHER'S UPDATE

MAY 2023

Dear Students, Parents and Carers

It is hard to believe that exam season is upon us again and summer is just on the horizon. This is always an exceptionally busy term in school as students sit their final GCSE and A Level exams and we prepare for the year ahead, but it's been wonderful to see so many events taking place across our campus, many of which are highlighted within this newsletter.

This term has been full of activity and it has been great to see so many positive aspects of our community recognised by others, especially our Trustees. Trustees recently spent a day in school, visiting lessons, speaking with staff and students and their feedback was exceptionally positive:

"The students were effusive in their praise for the school, its culture and the Environment".

"Students felt challenged in their work, that they were "pushed to their full potential" and recognised there were always ways to improve work."

- "The panel considered behaviour to be good and recognised it was supervised. This contributed to them feeling safe in the school and that staff were visible (including citing Mr Teece, Mr Godwin and other staff as being visible at the gate at the start and end of the day)."
- "There were no concerns about bullying in the school. Students felt assured that any incidences of bullying would be dealt with and they all were confident in how they would report issues."

"The tutor reading session was impressive in its consistency of practice".

"All staff spoke eloquently and positively about leadership in the school and the general feeling of effective teamwork in all faculties."

"Staff noted an improvement in student behaviour and a greater consistency in classroom practice because of the new behaviour code."

As you would expect they also identified areas that could be improved further and we will be addressing this with our community in the coming term. The key priorities being:

- Increasing student engagement in lessons and ensuring students are not able to be passive learners.
- Ensure the campus culture is consistently adhered to by all and remove pockets of inconsistency
- Continue to embed the systems and routines that have been enacted as both students and staff have welcomed the improvements seen over the past years.

In addition to this, we were very pleased that in a recent Peer Review with 3 local Secondary Headteachers, they again reported very similar findings and could see the progress that had been made.


Our school has also been part of an exciting AI trial with Arbor Education and continues to be an Ambassador school helping shape the future of technology in education. We have recently implemented a new Post 16 sign-in system that has the ability to automatically sign students in and out with their devices improving our safeguarding of these students.

I have been delighted to see so many extra-curricular activities running across our campus, and in a wide variety of subject areas, and we have even more planned for the summer term. It finally feels like school is returning to normal.

Despite the recent disruptions to education, I am pleased that our attendance remains above the national average, as this gives our students the best chance of success and I thank parents / carers for their continued support in this area.

As we plan for next year, I will be sharing a Parent Survey shortly and would ask that all parents and carers share your thoughts so these can be used to shape our next steps. Your views are valued and are always taken into consideration.

SAFEGUARDING INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

As a campus we give the highest priority to safeguarding our children and young people in all aspects of their school and college lives. This means that staff and volunteers must be alert to possible concerns about every student, and to report these in a proper fashion. The campus has a safeguarding and child protection policy which parents/carers can view on our website; <u>www.brookvalegroby.com</u>

In order to effectively safeguard all students and adults on site it is important that all visitors to school, including parents and carers, sign in at reception before they go anywhere else. All adults on the campus are asked to challenge any adults that they see on site who are not wearing identification which indicates that they have signed in at reception. Please do not go directly to the Groby building or any other part of the campus without first going to reception in the Brookvale building.

It is important for parents to be aware that:

- Staff and volunteers in the campus have a duty to report concerns about a child, whether this means the child may be in need of additional support or help of some kind or whether it is thought that a child may have been abused or be at risk of abuse.
- In some cases the campus is obliged to refer children to children's social care staff, for children to be assessed for their needs or if an investigation into possible child abuse is required.
- In many cases there will already have been discussions between campus staff and the parents of the child, and the situation and concerns will not be a surprise to the parents. However, parents may not be told that the campus has referred their child to children's social care if it is thought that this might put the child at risk.
- Children's social care tries to carry out its enquiries in a sensitive fashion. It has to gather information and generally it can be open with parents about the steps being taken.
- If you think your child may have been abused, or may be at risk, you should contact the children's social care office. If you think the abuse may have happened on campus, contact the Headteacher or the Designated Senior Person for Child Protection; Mr Godwin, Senior Deputy Headteacher. If you think your child has been hurt, arrange to visit your doctor. Comfort and reassure your child.

We'd like to start with an enormous WELL DONE to Year 12 who have now completed their mock fortnight. This has been such an important period of time for Year 12 and will form part of the final predicted grade that will be used for UCAS and Apprenticeship applications.



As Year 12 students near the end of their first year of A Levels they will start thinking about their future pathways. Our Post 18 tutor programme started on 15th May and will run for 3 weeks. This will cover all aspects of Post 18 and start to encourage students to invest some time into researching what is available to them and what they could be doing after their A Levels. 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POST 16 BCI STUDENTS VISIT THE BETT SHOW




YEAR 7 SLOTTABLE TOYS



Post 16 News

Our students in Year 12 and Year 13 are also facing exams this term. A-Level papers are on 6th, 13th and 20th June, as well as various combinations of modules for Further Maths students. In addition to this, the Year 12 Further Maths students are sitting external AS –Level exams this week, and Core Maths students face their exams next week. Please help us look after these students at this tough time for them...it's never much fun at this time of year!

Recently, our current Year 7 and 8 students have made the switch from Hegarty Maths to Sparx Maths for their main homework tasks. Sparx is designed so that students will receive homework based on their previous performance in homework tasks, and the difficulty will increase or decrease depending on their needs. They have the ability to watch short videos on that one desired skill for each question. This is to ensure that they are not overloaded cognitively and can complete work in smaller, more manageable chunks.

Sparx will send reminder emails to parents of students who have not completed the tasks before the due date, in order to encourage them to get ahead and complete the work on time. A huge well done to students in 8R1 and 8S1 who both had 100% completion rate in the first week.

We will be looking to move all year groups onto Sparx in the next academic year. Until then, they can continue to use Hegarty Maths as normal.


NEW STAIR RISERS - constantly improving our campus:

- Learned some phrases in Maori, Arabic and French plus one completely made up language
- Spent time in the past, the present and the future
- Read non-fiction, fantasy, horror, murder mystery, adventure, auto-biography, short stories and poetry

When students hit their teens, many of them stop reading for pleasure. We know that a lot of students struggle to do their twenty minutes a day of reading. We know too that there is a strong link between reading skills and academic success. With the TTRP in place, all of our students have the best opportunity to develop great



reading habits - and to broaden their experience of the world.
