HEADTEACHER'S UPDATE

September 2023

Dear Parents / Carers

Welcome to our first Newsletter of the year and it has been great to have all of our students back on campus. We have seen a really positive start to the new term and I have been really delighted to see that students have already achieved close to 10,000 achievement points.

It has been wonderful to welcome our new Year 7 students on campus too and they have settled in extremely well already. Year 7 Welcome Letter

BGLC continues to be a popular choice in the community with 240 students enrolling and a waiting list of families wanting a place at our school.

We were very pleased with the academic success of our students at both GCSE and A Level this year and we are confident that results will improve further in the coming years. The foundations have been securely laid for the year ahead and we look forward to working closely with all our students and stakeholders. It was a real privilege to welcome students back onto campus to celebrate their success in our recent Annual Awards Evening that recognised the amazingly talented students we have across our campus. A summary of our results was shared in the letter below:

GCSE & A Level Examinations Parent Letter

We continue to focus heavily on improving the culture across our campus in order to provide an excellent education for all our students. The shift in culture is evident across campus and on recent tours with prospective parents many commented on how calm, orderly, polite and respectful our students were. This is testament to the work undertaken and to your children. We will continue to raise our expectations so students receive the best educational experience possible and to this end, I would ask for your continued support with high standards of uniform (adherence to our policy) and ensuring your children arrive in school every day and on time. The DFE has asked all schools to focus strongly on improving attendance and this will be an area of focus for our school that will be discussed with students in the coming months. There has always been a strong link between academic success and strong attendance, so please always encourage your child to attend school. Our approach to attendance is outlined here.

As always, we will be seeking the views of all stakeholders to guide our work in the year ahead and we will shortly be sharing an email to a survey conducted by an external company called Kirkland Rowell. They collate and share the data with us and this in turn will be shared with you and highlight what we do well and what we need to improve further. So, I would encourage all parents and carers to share their views by the given deadline as your views really matter to us.

We are delighted to have secured two CIF bids to improve our school further. One for new windows in the Groby building and another for a new block of classrooms with 20 additional toilets. Planning permission has just been submitted and we are hoping work will commence in the new year. The toilets will make a huge difference to our community and have been a regular issue raised by students as we have too few.

This term is always an exceptionally busy term in school but I am really looking forward to continuing to serve our community and work with our amazing young people, it is a real privilege.

Week commencing the 11th September, was the BGLC annual residential trip to Normandy.




We visited Falaise castle, home of William the Conqueror, and saw the world-famous Bayeux Tapestry.

SAFEGUARDING INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

As a campus we give the highest priority to safeguarding our children and young people in all aspects of their school and campus lives. This means that staff and volunteers must be alert to possible concerns about every student, and to report these in a proper fashion. The campus has a safeguarding and child protection policy which parents/carers can view on our website;

www.brookvalegroby.com

In order to effectively safeguard all students and adults on site it is important that all visitors to school, including parents and carers, sign in at reception before they go anywhere else. All adults on the campus are asked to challenge any adults that they see on site who are not wearing identification which indicates that they have signed in at reception. Please do not go directly to the Groby building or any other part of the campus without first going to reception in the Brookvale building.

It is important for parents/carers to be aware that:

- Staff and volunteers in the campus have a duty to report concerns about a child, whether this means the child may be in need of additional support or help of some kind or whether it is thought that a child may have been abused or be at risk of abuse.
- In some cases the campus is obliged to refer children to children's social care staff, for children to be assessed for their needs or if an investigation into possible child abuse is required.
- In many cases there will already have been discussions between campus staff and the parents/carers of the child, and the situation and concerns will not be a surprise to the parents. However, parents may not be told that the campus has referred their child to children's social care if it is thought that this might put the child at risk.
- Children's social care tries to carry out its enquiries in a sensitive fashion. It has to gather information and generally it can be open with parents about the steps being taken.
- If you think your child may have been abused, or may be at risk, you should contact the children's social care office. If you think the abuse may have happened on campus, contact the Headteacher or the Designated Senior Person for Child Protection, who is Mr Godwin, Senior Deputy Headteacher. If you think your child has been hurt, arrange to visit your doctor. Comfort and reassure your child.

YEAR 7 GEOGRAPHY HOMEWORK


Year 7 are superlative! The biggest and the best!





























MENTAL HEALTH FOCUS

Students will spend part of each lesson focussing on their own mental health and learning more about support available.






Summer of Fun!

- Exam Success Evening Thursday 8th February 2024 Parents and students invited to outline how to have exam success across the range of subjects.



First of all, a warm welcome to our new and returning students into our BGLC Post 16. I hope you get settled into your new environment quickly and you jump into good routines.



Tutor groups have all now started reading their first books of the academic year.


Each day, tutors will read to their tutor groups a carefully-selected book title for 10 minutes.

The Tutor Time Reading Programme has various benefits for both students and tutors, such as:


- Exposure to a diverse set of texts, both fiction and non-fiction

Here are the books we are currently reading:












The story is about a family having to escape the Syrian war, leaving almost all their belongings behind. **Year 9:** This WW1 novel follows the fortunes of two young brothers who sign up to fight. The experience will test their love and friendship, and the end will have you in tears.

Year 10: How would you respond if your brother was killed in a gangland shooting? The main character in this novel is taking an elevator ride to the ground floor with a gun in his back pocket. What will he decide to do?







Year 11: Joe Simpson and his climbing partner Simon Yates were descending a mountain when Joe was involved in a terrible accident.

Year 12: This is a fantasy novel about the choices we make everyday. Whilst the initial premise might seem gloomy, it is an uplifting book.

Nora, the main character, is fed up with life, but over the course of the novel, her outlook changes. **Year 13:** Five students head into detention but only four survive. See if you can guess the culprit before the big reveal in the final pages.
