MERRY CHRISTMAS AND A HAPPY NEW YEAR!

Dear Parent/Carer,

This time of year can be quite challenging for people and it's not helped by the turmoil reported within the news, be it events in the Middle East, the cost of living, homelessness, climate change, severe weather events and political unrest. It would be quite easy to feel quite pessimistic about the world we are living in and what the future holds for our young people but this term has shown how brilliant our children are and the exceptional things they are capable of. I have been delighted to see students presented with certificates across all faculties, excel in sporting fixtures, perform for open mic nights and take part in a myriad of activities outside of school. We have so many talented and inspiring young people at BGLC and I feel very fortunate to work alongside them.

Our attendance continues to be above the national average for all year groups and improved on last year. This is critical for future success and our own results show the negative impact of poor attendance, so a sincere thank you to all parents / carers in supporting your children to be in school. This is a positive start to the year, which we need to maintain.

The national and local GCSE and A Level data has now been released and BGLC is above national average for all baseline measures and in the top 20 schools in Leicestershire, we are determined to be even higher this year. Our Year 11/13 students commenced mocks this week and their behaviour has been impeccable and it is clear they realise the importance of these examinations in preparing for the future.

We recently received our Stakeholder voice reports from Kirkland Rowell, and we have been pleased to see so many areas of strength highlighted across parents, staff and students. It was apparent there is a lot we are getting right, but also some very clear areas of improvement to work on in the term ahead. I have recently communicated the findings of these reports to parents here. Our recently launched 'BGLC Change Makers' will be working with their peers to address the concerns of the student body, and will be working closely with myself and other staff. I want all our students to feel like they have a voice and a group of student leaders that truly represent them and can work on their behalf. It has been a highlight of my week working with these young people every Thursday lunchtime.

We have also worked closely with a number of outside agencies this term to develop our student body and approaches in school. Staff have undergone several hours of training from the Leicestershire VRN (Violence Reduction Network), with a view to creating student mentors in violence reduction and supporting our young people in making better choices. Progressive Masculinity have also worked with a group of KS4 boys around positive male role models and traits and how they can be better role models for our younger students. We are hoping this work has a positive impact across our campus.

Over the past weeks I have also been privileged to tour Year 6 families around our campus during the school day, and several Headteachers from our local Secondary and Primary schools, all have commented on how polite our students are, and how calm, orderly and purposeful lessons have been. I welcome parents who may wish to do the same to book a tour with my PA. Our close working relationship with our Primary Partners was showcased last week at the 'Talk the Talk' event which was superb, and we have many other transition events planned. Our Year 7 admissions numbers also came in last week, and once again we are over subscribed.

So whilst the world may not be perfect and we have areas to improve, there are lots to celebrate and be positive about at BGLC, and we look forward to the term ahead.

I wish all of our families a relaxing Christmas break and thank you for your continued unwavering support this term. We look forward to welcoming students back on to campus on Monday 8th January 2024.

Service along with the reading of the names of each person.















POST 16 - NEXT STEPS

taken place we will then be sending out our confirmation letters. We will also be inviting all applicants to join us for two induction days in June to meet with the Post 16 Team, tutors and get a feel for what Post 16 life is all about.

YEAR 13 UCAS DEADLINES

By now the majority of our Year 13 students will be nearing completion of their Personal Statements and will be starting to focus on completing their online UCAS applications ready to be sent. We would like the majority of our students to have sent their applications before Christmas and remind them of our deadline which is Monday 18th December 2023. We understand that not all students will be ready by our deadline date but hope to have as many sent off as possible. The official UCAS Deadline is 31st January 2024, we would need students to have completed and sent to us at the school no later than 24th January 2024 to ensure we have time to check and add grades and references.

ATTENDANCE

As you will be aware we have sent out letters to all students and parents regarding student attendance. Attendance is an extremely important part of A level study and studies have shown the importance of excellent attendance and overall outcomes.

When the outcomes from students of equal 'ability' are compared – those with attendance of over <u>95%</u> perform greater than one grade higher per subject at A Level than those with attendance below 85%

One week's holiday/absence/illness per year during term time = a 3% fall in attendance.

We want to keep students and parents up to date with their attendance percentages and will continue to send out letters each term. Should your attendance decline, the Post 16 Team will meet with you to discuss ways in which we can support you to increase your attendance to school to ensure you achieve the grades you deserve.

SAFEGUARDING INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

As a campus we give the highest priority to safeguarding our children and young people in all aspects of their school and college lives. This means that staff and volunteers must be alert to possible concerns about every student, and to report these in a proper fashion. The campus has a safeguarding and child protection policy which parents/carers can view on our website; www.brookvalegroby.com

In order to effectively safeguard all students and adults on site it is important that all visitors to school, including parents and carers, sign in at reception before they go anywhere else. All adults on the campus are asked to challenge any adults that they see on site who are not wearing identification which indicates that they have signed in at reception. Please do not go directly to the Groby building or any other part of the campus without first going to reception in the Brookvale building.

It is important for parents to be aware that:

- Staff and volunteers in the campus have a duty to report concerns about a child, whether this means the child may be in need of
 additional support or help of some kind or whether it is thought that a child may have been abused or be at risk of abuse.
- In some cases the campus is obliged to refer children to children's social care staff, for children to be assessed for their needs or if an investigation into possible child abuse is required.
- In many cases there will already have been discussions between campus staff and the parents/carers of the child, and the situation and concerns will not be a surprise to them. However, parents may not be told that the campus has referred their child to children's social care if it is thought that this might put the child at risk.
- Children's social care tries to carry out its enquiries in a sensitive fashion. It has to gather information and generally it can be
 open with parents about the steps being taken.
- If you think your child may have been abused, or may be at risk, you should contact the children's social care office. If you think the abuse may have happened on campus, contact the Headteacher or the Designated Senior Person for Child Protection, who is Mr Godwin, Senior Deputy Headteacher. If you think your child has been hurt, arrange to visit your doctor. Comfort and reassure your child.


What will <u>WE</u> do?

You may not see the consequences of reporting it, but that does not mean it has not been dealt with.








LOST PROPERTY

READING PLUS

After a successful trial with some of our wonderful KS3 students, Reading Plus has now been rolled out to all Year 7, 8 and 9 students in English. Each week, students will have the opportunity to log-on to our new Chromebooks and read their choice of text from a variety of genres that interest them. This lesson helps to motivate our students to become independent and confident readers by introducing new vocabulary and helping them read with developed fluency. Please encourage your child to engage with the programme as part of our 20 minutes of daily reading at home. They are asked to complete 4 reading texts and 1 vocabulary lesson per week to make the best progress in their reading levels. Over the course of the year, we will be using Reading Plus as assessment points to help monitor students' reading progress and develop their individual reading skills from *Close Reading* to *Reasoning and Rhetoric*.

Good luck to our Year 11 & Year 13 students who begin their mock exams week commencing 20th November.




MENTAL HEALTH AND WELLBEING

POSITIVITY AMBASSADORS

A group of Year 8 girls are now trained as positive ambassadors. The students participated in a wellbeing course for 8 weeks with the goal of improving the mental health of young people, improving self-esteem and confidence. Half of the session involved a discussion on different mental health topics, followed by fitness activities like yoga. The sessions followed the NHS 5 steps to Mental Health Wellbeing, these steps include:

- 1. Connect: Building and maintaining positive relationships.
- 2. Be Active: Incorporating physical activity into daily routines.
- 3. Take Notice: Being mindful of the present moment.
- 4. Keep Learning: Engaging in continuous learning and personal development.
- 5. Give: Contributing to the community and supporting others.

The students are planning to use their new ambassador status to support the wellbeing of other students on campus and we wanted to say well done!



You can now find the full set of books in the school library – come and have a look!


