

What are we learning this term?

Topic 2: Externally Set Assignment

In this unit of work, students will select one question from the exam paper - They will follow a similar journey as the extended project (Identity). Students' will carry out artists research based on their chosen question, create transcriptions of the artists work and create a moodboard related to the theme/genre. Initial ideas will be created along with development work, which will lead to a final design. Each idea will be annotated to inform us of the students' thought process and include information regarding the possible choice of materials, techniques and processes they could use. A final design will be created, which will lead to additional development work using a varied range of materials, techniques and processes, then ultimately a written action plan, alongside a mock-up of intentions. The students will then start the journey of creating a personal response which will be created under exam conditions over a two-day period. Students' will mount-up their work and write-up an evaluation prior to the exam period.

What are we learning this term?

Students will continue to complete their NEA 2 Food preparation assessment this term

NEA 2 brief is set by AQA. In this task, students will prepare, cook and present a final menu of three dishes to meet the needs of a specific context. Students must select appropriate technical skills and processes and create 3–4 dishes to showcase their skills. They will then produce their final menu within a single period of no more than 3 hours, planning in advance how this will be achieved.'

What are we learning this term?

Externally set Assignment (40% of GCSE Grade):

The students will receive their exam paper for the first lesson back after the Christmas holidays. Students will commence the exam by mind mapping a question that interests them to identify a theme that they are happy with for a project of their choosing. Students will have all of this term to produce initial research, write a project brief, produce artist work and then start to design their first graphic outcome for their project.

Students will have teacher support throughout the initial phase of the exam. Students will need to ensure that they are keeping up with homeworks and weekly deadlines so that this supports their workload in the exam.

When students commence the official exam sessions after the Easter Holiday, they will be starting their 10 hours in exam conditions. As soon as students start this time, staff are not permitted to support students by giving feedback. This is why it is vital that students work hard to complete their first Graphic Outcome by the Easter break.

Please note that the exam is fast paced and students will always have something to do at home to support their progress during this final stage of the course.

Enrichment

Y11s will have Extended Support sessions available to help them to complete their exam work outside of lesson time so that they succeed in the subject. Sessions will be run at either lunchtimes and/or after school in G11.

Homework

For homework, students are expected to complete exam tasks started in the lesson. These are posted in the Google Classroom. Each student will have their own theme, therefore homeworks varies from student to student, but it is expected that all students are staying in line with the Y11 academic year calendar.

Students have access to Knowledge Organisers on Google Classroom to support them with home learning.

A subject drive has been created for all students so that they have access to all materials to help them at home. This is shared with students in lessons.

Assessments

Students will receive ongoing verbal feedback throughout this Exam unit as well as their work being graded at key points over the term so that they can effectively track their progress.

Please note that when the students work is graded and they receive Current Predicted Grades and Current Working Grades, this will also take into consideration their coursework unit (60% of GCSE grade) that was submitted in December before the holidays.

It is vital for the exam that the students are tracking their progress as well as completing their PLC. Verbal feedback will be recorded by students in lessons on their Google Slides so that they can refer back to this for support in lessons and at home.



What are we learning this term?

In Lifeskills, students cover topics within three core themes: Health and Wellbeing, Relationships and Living in the Wider World. These themes include our statutory responsibilities to teach about Careers and Relationship and Sex Education. This term, students will be looking at the following topics:

The Lifeskills curriculum is designed to be flexible. While the topics above are planned to be delivered in sequence, these may change to tackle in school or national issues that impact our students. Students have a Lifeskills lesson once a week.

Lifeskills tackles important issues that we believe help to develop a well rounded individual. This means that we have a system of support for students who may find some of the learning challenging. Students are always signposted to support that is available to them in and out of school.

What are we learning this term?

Topic 1:

Exam Component 1A Television. In this section we look at two texts; Cuffs episode 1 and The Avengers episode 1. We will examine various scenes from both, paying attention to the media language and audio-visual codes such as camera direction, sound, lighting and mise-en-scene. We will also do several exam questions and work through the timings and process of the exam and how you should make notes during the viewing.

Topic 2:

Exam Component 1B Promoting the media. This half term we are revising the ways in which the Lego Movie was marketed and promoted to audiences. We are analysing the film poster, the film trailer, the TV adverts and looking in detail at the Lego Movie video game and how audiences respond to it.

What are we learning this term?

Externally set Assignment (40% of GCSE Grade):

The students will receive their exam paper in their first lesson back after the Christmas holidays. Students will commence the exam by mind mapping a question that interests them to identify a theme that they are happy with for a project of their choosing. Students will have all of this term to produce initial research, write a design brief, produce artist research work and then start to develop and design their transcriptions and ideas for manufacture.

Students will have teacher support throughout the initial phase of the exam. Students will need to ensure that they are keeping up with homeworks and weekly deadlines so that this supports their workload in the exam.

When students commence the official exam sessions after the Easter Holiday, they will be starting their 10 hours in exam conditions. As soon as students start this time, staff are not permitted to support students by giving feedback. This is why it is vital that students work hard to complete the necessary work by the Easter break.

Please note that the exam is fast paced and students will always have something to do at home to support their progress during this final stage of the course.
