## CAMPUS NEWSLETTER

Dear Parent / Carers

Welcome to our latest newsletter and I hope you find it both informative and insightful into the life of our school. The Christmas break now seems like a distant memory and this term is one of the most important and busiest in the school year. Our GCSE and A-Level students have had their mock exam results back and now the hard work begins in reality to address their knowledge gaps and exam technique so they can achieve their full potential in the summer examinations. We have exam success evenings planned for both Year 11 and 13 cohorts and I would strongly advise that parents and carers engage in these to be able to support your children effectively and be aware of our plans in school. We are determined to ensure all our students excel and we beat last year's results. Work has already begun in school with our Progress Leaders and there is a wide range of support in school for students who need individual input. It was fantastic to see so many students in Year 11 attend the Big Revise event following mock results day.



This term is also incredibly important for our Year 9 students who will be choosing their GCSE options and it was wonderful to welcome so many parents to our recent Options Evening, which resulted in a full house and standing room only.

As a school we have been really focussing on the importance of attendance and whilst I am pleased, we are above the National Average for secondary schools, this is still an area of concern for me, given the strong correlation to attainment and success. There are close to 240 students who are persistently absent (<90%) and we know this is hugely damaging to their attainment and progress. When a child is persistently absent, they miss over 95 learning hours, this increases to 190 hours missed when attendance is 80%.

Our GCSE results last year showed extremely strong outcomes for those students whose attendance was over 90%, so being in school is the single most important thing parents / carers can do to support your child's academic success.

Worryingly our two examination year groups have some of the lowest attendance, our current attendance by Year group sits at:

We have continued to drive on our rewards first culture and on average we are awarding over 9000 achievement points each week and many students have been recognised by our subjects' rewards focus too. It has been wonderful to see so many of our students being recognised in assemblies for their progress, effort and success. I have signed a lot of certificates this term, which is a real highlight of my role.

Our school continues to be a popular choice and will be oversubscribed again in this coming year, our Post 16 numbers are also looking very positive for next year and I was delighted with the outstanding feedback our Post 16 received in the recent Kirkland Rowell survey.

Every term we endeavour to be better than we were the term before, as such the school and Trustees have commissioned a number of external agencies to provide scrutiny and challenge of our work. I'm a firm believer in external challenges in order to ensure our school grows. Last week we had an ex-HMI and practising OFSTED Inspector visit from another Trust to provide some challenge and scrutiny to the work of our Senior Leadership Team. As you can imagine such activities highlight the many positives we do, but also give some clear actions for improvement, which we are working on this term.

As always, I would like to thank all of our parents and carers for your ongoing support, it makes such a difference in your child's educational experience.

## AWARD WINNER!

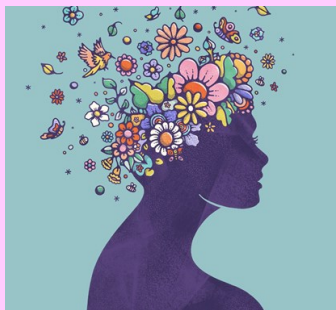

HOW TO COLLECT: Please email the EXAMS TEAM [exams@brookvalegroby.com](mailto:exams@brookvalegroby.com) to arrange an appointment for you to collect your certificates.

If you are unable to collect your certificates personally we will need **YOUR permission** (via email) for someone else to collect on your behalf.

It is extremely important that these are collected. These are legal documents that colleges, universities and employers will want to see original certificates. If you misplace these they cost between £40 and £55 each to replace (depending on exam board).

All students with entries for the Summer 2024 exams will be receiving a statement of entry. The Exams Team will notify parents via the Parent Bulletin that these have gone to students.

Please can you ensure that these are looked at carefully.

## SAFEGUARDING INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

As a campus we give the highest priority to safeguarding our children and young people in all aspects of their school and college lives. This means that staff and volunteers must be alert to possible concerns about every student, and to report these in a proper fashion. The campus has a safeguarding and child protection policy which parents/carers can view on our website; [www.brookvalegroby.com](http://www.brookvalegroby.com)

**In order to effectively safeguard all students and adults on site it is important that all visitors to school, including parents and carers, sign in at reception before they go anywhere else. All adults on the campus are asked to challenge any adults that they see on site who are not wearing identification which indicates that they have signed in at reception. Please do not go directly to the Groby building or any other part of the campus without first going to reception in the Brookvale building.**

It is important for parents to be aware that:

- Staff and volunteers in the campus have a duty to report concerns about a child, whether this means the child may be in need of additional support or help of some kind or whether it is thought that a child may have been abused or be at risk of abuse.
- In some cases the campus is obliged to refer children to children's social care staff, for children to be assessed for their needs or if an investigation into possible child abuse is required.
- In many cases there will already have been discussions between campus staff and the parents/carers of the child, and the situation and concerns will not be a surprise to them. However, parents may not be told that the campus has referred their child to children's social care if it is thought that this might put the child at risk.
- Children's social care tries to carry out its enquiries in a sensitive fashion. It has to gather information and generally it can be open with parents about the steps being taken.
- If you think your child may have been abused, or may be at risk, you should contact the children's social care office. If you think the abuse may have happened on campus, contact the Headteacher or the Designated Senior Person for Child Protection, who is Mr Godwin, Senior Deputy Headteacher. If you think your child has been hurt, arrange to visit your doctor. Comfort and reassure your child.

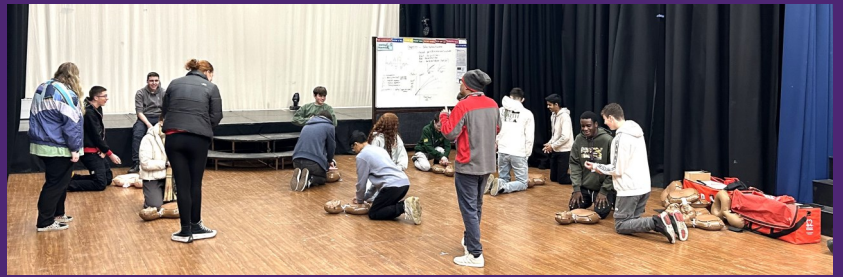

## MENTORING

We are excited to announce that Oppidan Education has offered us a fantastic opportunity to train 20 of our Year 12 students as mentors. We applied for a grant covering the cost and we were successful in our bid.

There are four steps to the programme:

1. Three hours of small-group workshops where students learn to be effective mentors, developing skills such as oracy, listening and leadership.
2. Following early experience as mentors, Y12s come together again for Part 2 of mentor training with deeper case studies and practical next steps for each student mentor.
3. Alongside resources provided for peer-peer sessions, we run an online focus group with selected students to gather feedback and offer advice for scheme improvement.
4. After a group assembly, adult mentors meet Y12s for 30-minute 1:1 sessions, providing an external ear for goal setting, guidance and motivation for what lies ahead.

## PRAISE AND REWARDS IN PE



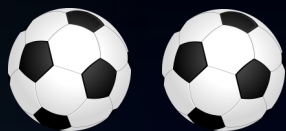

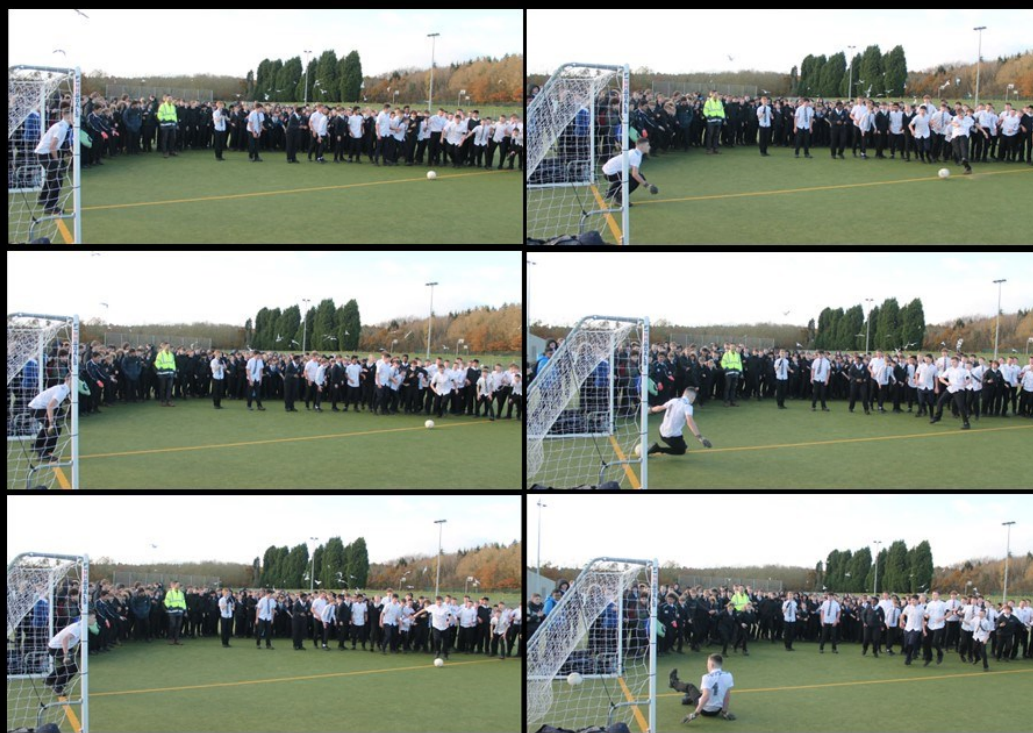
