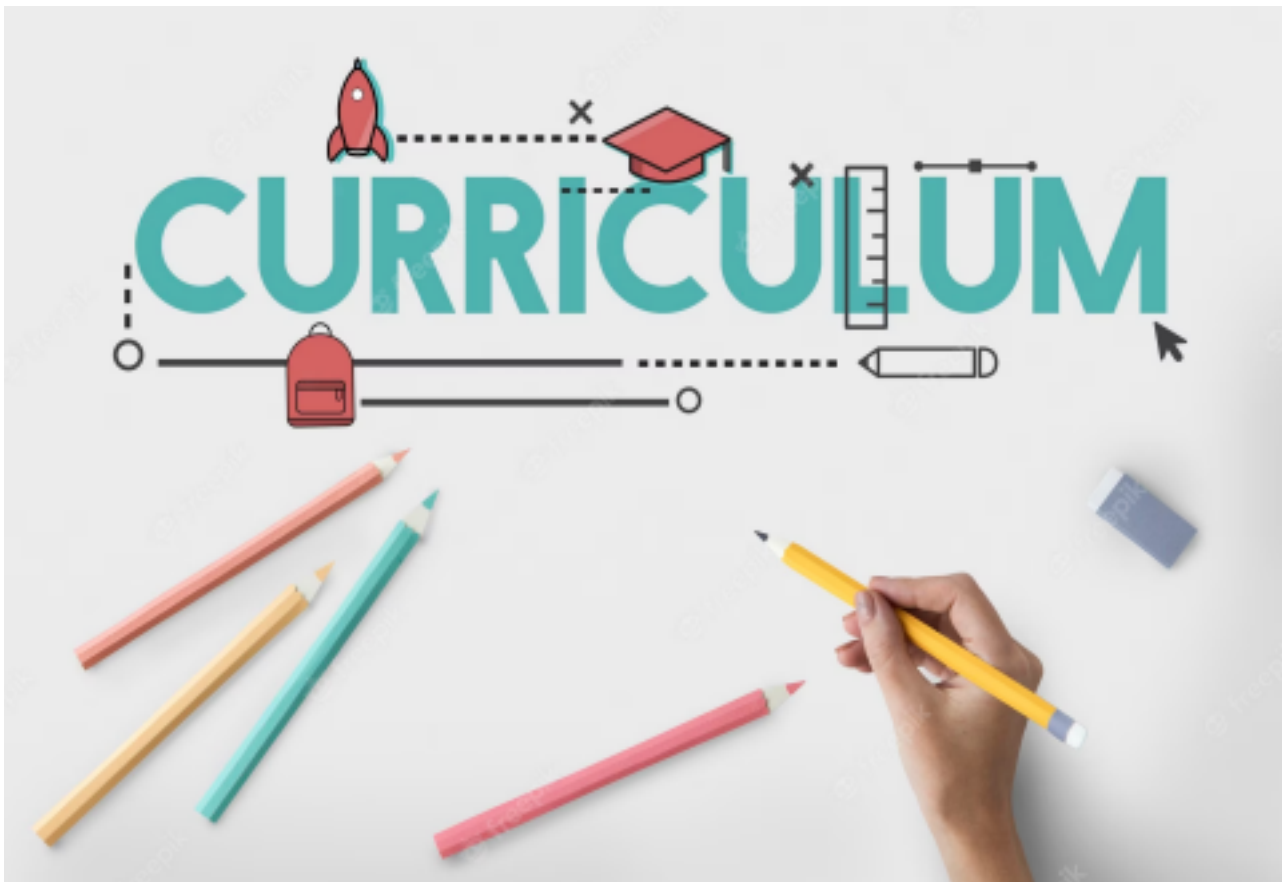

What are we learning this term?

Topic 2: Externally Set Assignment

In this unit of work, students will select one question from the exam paper - They will follow a similar journey as the extended project (Identity). Students' will carry out artists research based on their chosen question, create transcriptions of the artists work and create a moodboard related to the theme/genre. Initial ideas will be created along with development work, which will lead to a final design. Each idea will be annotated to inform us of the students' thought process and include information regarding the possible choice of materials, techniques and processes they could use. A final design will be created, which will lead to additional development work using a varied range of materials, techniques and processes, then ultimately a written action plan, alongside a mock-up of intentions. The students will then start the journey of creating a personal response which will be created under exam conditions over a two-day period. Students' will mount-up their work and write-up an evaluation prior to the exam period.

Students are revising for their external exam which is worth 50% of their final grade. This exam will measure how students have achieved the following assessment objectives.
AO1- Demonstrate knowledge and understanding of nutrition, food, cooking and preparation

AO4- Analyse and evaluate different aspects of nutrition, food, cooking and preparation including food made by themselves and others.

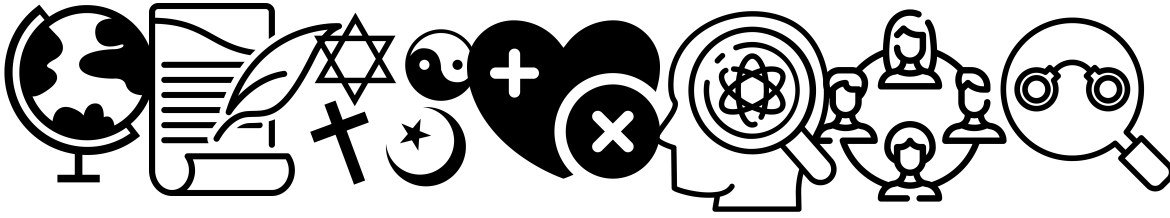

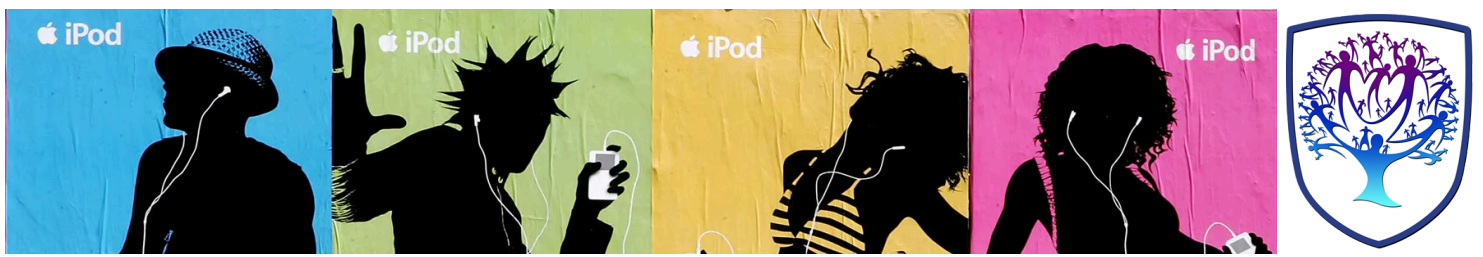

What are we learning this term?

Externally set Assignment (40% of GCSE Grade):

This term will see the students continue and complete their exam project.

When students commence the official exam sessions after the Easter Holiday, they will be starting their 10 hours in exam conditions. As soon as students start this time, staff are not permitted to support students by giving feedback. This is why it is vital that students work hard to complete their first Graphic Outcome by the Easter break.

The Graphics exam dates are 15th April, 16th April and 17th April. After these exam sessions the students will complete exam board paperwork and final pieces and artist transcriptions will need to be saved into a shared drive for access for the moderator should they need to see them in more detail.

After this, students will be using Graphics lesson time to revise for their other GCSE subjects. It is vital that students bring work to their lessons so that they can study and be fully prepared for their upcoming exams.

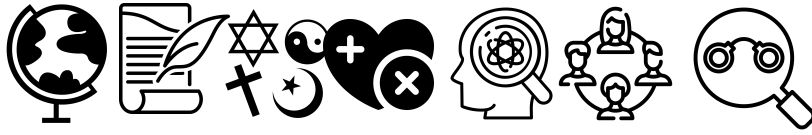
Students will receive RAW marks for both of their exam unit and coursework unit this term.

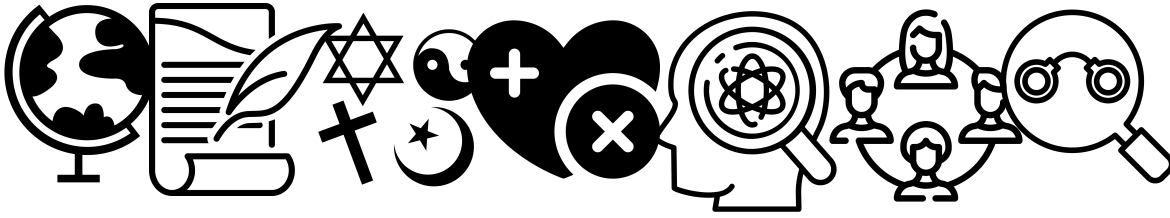

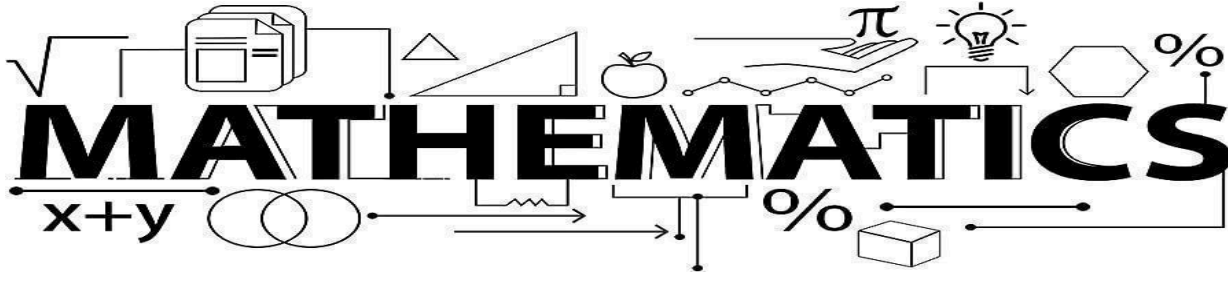

What are we learning this term?

Practical lessons this term are likely to be outside as we lose the Sports Hall for external exams in May, so students will need to be prepared to have their PE lessons outside. As the weather changes and the temperature increases please ensure that students bring water to their PE lessons and wear sun cream.

Core PE - students will have lessons in some of the following activities this term: football, volleyball, Outdoor Education, softball, hockey, tennis, rounders and athletics.

GCSE PE - the focus will be on revision for the upcoming exams in May and June.

CNAT Sport Studies - the focus on lessons will be preparing for the upcoming R184 exam in May. We will finish teaching the theoretical content and work on preparing students for the assessment. 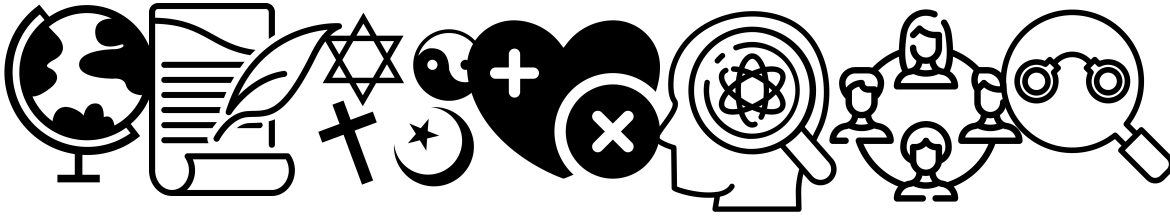

What are we learning this term?

Externally set Assignment (40% of GCSE Grade):

The students have been working on their exam paper since the first lesson back after the Christmas holidays.

Students will commence the official exam sessions after the Easter Holiday, (week beginning 15th April) they will have 10 hours to complete their practical piece, which is under exam conditions. As soon as students start this time, staff are not permitted to support students by giving feedback. This is why it is vital that students have worked hard to complete the necessary work by the Easter break.

After the exam has concluded, students will have paperwork from the examination board to complete, they will then spend the remainder of their time using lessons for revision purposes. Students will be expected to bring exam revision work with them and will not be allowed to leave the lesson to go and speak to teachers or get work.
