
Ellen was amazing, and we have asked her to come back to inspire more of our Post 16 students next year too!






# NEW YEAR 12 INDUCTION DAYS


On Tuesday morning we played a game of Bingo with some great prizes...

#### SAFEGUARDING INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

As a campus we give the highest priority to safeguarding our children and young people in all aspects of their school and college lives. This means that staff and volunteers must be alert to possible concerns about every student, and to report these in a proper fashion. The campus has a safeguarding and child protection policy which parents/carers can view on our website; <a href="www.brookvalegroby.com">www.brookvalegroby.com</a>

In order to effectively safeguard all students and adults on site it is important that all visitors to school, including parents and carers, sign in at reception before they go anywhere else. All adults on the campus are asked to challenge any adults that they see on site who are not wearing identification which indicates that they have signed in at reception. Please do not go directly to the Groby building or any other part of the campus without first going to reception in the Brookvale building.

#### It is important for parents to be aware that:

- Staff and volunteers in the campus have a duty to report concerns about a child, whether this means the child may be in need of additional support or help of some kind or whether it is thought that a child may have been abused or be at risk of abuse.
- In some cases the campus is obliged to refer children to children's social care staff, for children to be assessed for their needs or if an investigation into possible child abuse is required.
- In many cases there will already have been discussions between campus staff and the parents of the child, and the situation and concerns will not be a surprise to the parents. However, parents may not be told that the campus has referred their child to children's social care if it is thought that this might put the child at risk.
- Children's social care tries to carry out its enquiries in a sensitive fashion. It has to gather information and generally it can be open with parents about the steps being taken.
- If you think your child may have been abused, or may be at risk, you should contact the children's social care office. If you think the abuse may have happened on campus, contact the Headteacher or the Designated Senior Person for Child Protection, who is Mr Godwin, Senior Deputy Headteacher. If you think your child has been hurt, arrange to visit your doctor. Comfort and reassure your child.

We are continually reviewing and updating our stock of books, and have invested in a number of new books which have either been requested by students, or are currently very popular, here are just some of them:








#### Thank you!



## **READING UPDATES**

#### **Reading Plus**

Thank you to all our students, parents, family members, carers, and teachers who have been supporting Reading Plus. This is a new programme we introduced this year within KS3 English lessons, our 20/20/20 reading homework and KS4 flex lessons to help students reach their potential with their reading and vocabulary skills. As a school, we have made excellent progress and together we have read **74,778,228 words**!

Since our first baseline assessment, students have made great progress and gains in their reading. 9% of students have progressed from 5+ years below their reading age level and an additional 16% of students are now reading at or above their reading age level. On average, students have increased their reading speed by 58 wpm and 42% of students are reading at or above their projected progress for the year.



#### Year 8 student Evie Coombes - Reading Plus Success!

Congratulations to Evelyn Coombes of 8S1 who has completed the Reading Plus programme. EveyIn has read through 5 reading levels (equivalent to 5 academic years) to have now conquered the level M reading level - which is an equivalent reading level to that of a Year 13 student. She has also mastered 180 words in the vocabulary section and read 253,657 words! This special achievement means that Reading Plus will be sending Evelyn a gift package including a book of her choice. Congratulations Evelyn and to everyone who has read well to improve their reading skills over this past year.
