HEADTEACHER'S UPDATE

September 2024

Dear Parents / Carers

Welcome to our first Newsletter of the year and it has been great to have all of our students back on campus. We have seen a really positive start to the new term and I have been really delighted to see that students have already achieved close to 10,000 achievement points.

It has been wonderful to welcome students back onto campus and they have already made such a brilliant start to the new academic year. I have been hugely impressed with how well students have adapted to our systems and routines and it has been fantastic to see our Rewards 1st culture really embedded. A campus culture and associated routines have made a significant difference in creating a calm, safe and purposeful learning environment.

I was delighted with the success our students saw at both GCSE and A-Level, placing our outcomes significantly above the national averages for all key benchmarks. This is testament to the hard work and dedication of our students, so a big well done to them all. I would also like to recognise and thank our staff who have supported students in achieving this success and our parents / careers for working in partnership with us. Results headlines can be found here.

We are extremely excited to have secured funding to build four new classrooms and 18 new toilets. Building work commenced over the summer holidays and is due to be completed by the end of October 2024. This new block replaces some of the existing mobile classrooms and adds much needed capacity with regard to toilet facilities. We will share images of the building progress in due course.

As a school we have focussed on culture kindness for the past three years, as we believe this has a significant part to play in our communities' success. Last year we spoke to students about national issues such as misogyny, homophobia and racism and the need for us to celebrate our differences and be a safe place where all students feel a strong sense of belonging. Belonging is this month's focus and we have been speaking to students about the riots that sadly swept our country and caused division within many communities this summer. We want to ensure our community is a place of acceptance, kindness and mutual respect and that all students feel confident to report and share their concerns. I have led assemblies at the start of term highlighting that racism has no place in our country or school community and will always be dealt with, when reported.

We are really looking forward to the term ahead and working alongside your children. Please take time to read our weekly bulletin and follow us on social media to see what's happening this term.



NORMANDY 2024 RESIDENTIAL TRIP

Week commencing the 16th September, was the BGLC annual residential trip to Normandy.

As usual we had a dual focus of French and History. We practiced our reading and speaking of French in a number of different towns including Honfleur, Bayeux and Arromanches. We learnt a little of French culture on our visit to a goat farm.

We visited Falaise castle, home of William the Conqueror, and saw the world-famous Bayeux Tapestry.

We also visited a number of sites linked to the D-Day landings of 1944 and held our usual act of remembrance in the British War Cemetery in Bayeux. Our students were complimented on several occasions by members of the public about their excellent behaviour and were generally a pleasure to work with across the whole week.

In the evenings we visited the beach, played ball games outside our hotel and spent a little bit of time recapping our day and preparing for what we would see the following day.











In total 44 students and 5 staff made the journey, and along with everything that we all learned, we all came back knowing some people, who we had not known well before, a whole lot better, which is always one of the

great benefits of a residential trip. For example, we now know that Mrs Coley can't be trusted with keys, Mrs Brown is good at piggy backs but is less good at listening to instructions, Mr Dean is a little scared of running goats and Mr Godwin likes a game of basketball. POST 16 NEWS

We are delighted to welcome all of our students back after the summer holiday.

Our Year 13 students have a very important year ahead. They will complete their UCAS application, if applying to University, or start researching Apprenticeships ready for their next step after A Levels. Mocks will take place in November and revision preparation for their upcoming exams will begin.

Here are a few key dates:

UCAS Early Entry Deadline: 15th October 2024

UCAS Application Deadline for BGLC: 13th December 2024

UCAS Final Deadline: 29th January 2025

Mock Weeks: 18th November to 29th November 2024 - Exam timetables will be issued closer to the date.



Our New Year 12 students have begun their Post 16 journey and are settling in well. They are a bigger cohort than the Year 13's and are starting to form good study habits, using their study periods to ensure they are on top of their work, this will be essential as the workload starts to increase in the coming weeks. Students are bonding and forming friendships within their tutor groups and subjects classes and they have taken part in a team exercise run by the Army which they all seemed to gain valuable skills from.

Students left the session feeling much more confident about how to apply for finance, and how much they may be eligible to receive.

The Teen Health 11-19 Service provides early intervention support to Children and Young People to live healthier, happier lives. Our service is proudly organised by Leicestershire and Rutland County Councils, as part of the early help service. Teen Health provides health and emotional wellbeing advice and support to young people.

At Brookvale Groby Learning Campus the Health and Wellbeing Officer supporting students is Alesha. She is based at the school every Monday providing support



through drops in, one to one support and group work. Alesha can support with Emotional Wellbeing, Healthy Relationships and Healthy Lifestyles.

Drop-ins will be taking place during lunch time every Monday and will be held in the Calm Room 1.30pm - 2pm.



SAFEGUARDING INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

As a campus we give the highest priority to safeguarding our children and young people in all aspects of their school and campus lives. This means that staff and volunteers must be alert to possible concerns about every student, and to report these in a proper fashion. The campus has a safeguarding and child protection policy which parents/carers can view on our website;

www.brookvalegroby.com

In order to effectively safeguard all students and adults on site it is important that all visitors to school, including parents and carers, sign in at reception before they go anywhere else. All adults on the campus are asked to challenge any adults that they see on site who are not wearing identification which indicates that they have signed in at reception. Please do not go directly to the Groby building or any other part of the campus without first going to reception in the Brookvale building.

It is important for parents/carers to be aware that:

- Staff and volunteers in the campus have a duty to report concerns about a child, whether this means the child may be in need of additional support or help of some kind or whether it is thought that a child may have been abused or be at risk of abuse.
- In some cases the campus is obliged to refer children to children's social care staff, for children to be assessed for their needs or if an investigation into possible child abuse is required.
- In many cases there will already have been discussions between campus staff and the parents/carers of the child, and the situation and concerns will not be a surprise to the parents. However, parents may not be told that the campus has referred their child to children's social care if it is thought that this might put the child at risk.
- Children's social care tries to carry out its enquiries in a sensitive fashion. It has to gather information and generally it can be open with parents about the steps being taken.
- If you think your child may have been abused, or may be at risk, you should contact the children's social care office. If you think the abuse may have happened on campus, contact the Headteacher or the Designated Senior Person for Child Protection, who is Mr Godwin, Senior Deputy Headteacher. If you think your child has been hurt, arrange to visit your doctor. Comfort and reassure your child.

- Exam Success Evening Monday 14th February 2025 Parents and students invited to outline how to have exam success across the range of subjects.



















YEAR 11 CAREERS EVENING
