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KS3-Years 7, 8 and 9	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● KS3 Spellings - Dear Parent/Carer, As you will be aware this term in KS3 we have introduced spellings into our English homework booklets. Each week students have been tested on these spellings. using the back of their homework booklets to highlight those words they have spelt incorrectly. Over the break can you support us by retesting your child on these misspelt words; a note can be made in your child's planner as to how they did with this retest. Year 7	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Please see message below from Mrs Bellamy - Faculty Leader - English, Media & Literacy: It is routine practice for the class organisation in year 7 to be reviewed at the end of the first half term. We look at data that has come from the primary schools, alongside our Reading Plus data, and our growing knowledge of the students themselves. This year, in both R and S cohorts, we will have class 1 for the students with the highest primary school data and the highest reading ages, and a support set for students who require additional support and input to access our curriculum. The rest of the classes will be broadly mixed ability. After half term your child may find themselves in a different class and, or, a different teacher because of this restructuring. No child will be disadvantaged due to these moves; their progress - as well as their wellbeing - is of paramount importance to us. Thank you for your support.
