Dear Parent / Carers,

As we approach the spring season, I hope this newsletter finds you well. It's been an exceptionally busy half term, filled with a multitude of activities and achievements and I'm delighted to share some of the highlights with you.

Improving attendance is a national priority for schools in England. We are working hard to ensure that all students are in school every day, ready to learn. Every day counts, and even a few missed days can impact a child's progress. We encourage you to support us in this effort by ensuring your child attends school regularly and by communicating any absences promptly. We have recently appointed an Attendance Champion, Mr Goodger, to lead on this key area across our school. Already there has been a lot of focus on raising the profile of attendance and we see this linking to strong and improving attendance across all year groups.



Our students have demonstrated incredible dedication and resilience during their recent mock examinations. The effort and focus displayed has been truly inspiring, and we are immensely proud of their achievements. We are committed to supporting all students in achieving exam success. For Year 11, the BGLC Big Revise has been a huge success and there are lots of revision materials that have been shared with students across all subjects in the Google Drive. Significant work is also underway to support students with bespoke interventions to ensure future GCSE success. The recent 'Maximise Your Potential' was a brilliant event that walked students through effective revision approaches and how to deal with the pressures of examinations.

We also congratulate our Year 13 students who are continuing to make huge progress from their GCSE exams and are now receiving offers from UCAS including two students who have received an offer from the University of Cambridge. We'd also like to thank our Head Students who have made, and continue to make a significant contribution on campus.

The new build on campus is now complete and has already made a significant difference with 4 new classrooms and the addition of 20 new toilets, which has been particularly beneficial in reducing queuing times and improving the overall school experience.

Our "Rewards First" culture continues to flourish, and it's fantastic to see so many students embracing this positive approach and earning achievement points. Over 9,000 points have been awarded already this year, a testament to the hard work and dedication of our students.

We are incredibly proud of our students' commitment to community engagement. They have been involved in a variety of initiatives including raising money for charities, visiting local care homes, hosting coffee mornings and organising events within school. We believe in the importance of fostering a strong sense of community, and we are exploring further opportunities to develop these vital connections.

Our trustees have approved the merger with TMET and their trust has also given its approval. This is an exciting development that will bring many benefits to our school community. We will share further details as they become available.

This term is exceptionally busy for all our students, particularly Year 9 students who are making crucial decisions about their GCSE options. We understand the significance of this process and we are providing comprehensive guidance and support to help students make informed choices.

Thank you for your continued support. We look forward to a successful and productive remainder of the academic year.

In school we continue to encourage students to use the wellbeing platform youHQ: https://www.youhq.co.uk/

We believe that mental health is a vital aspect of overall wellbeing, and we want to provide a platform that empowers students to take proactive steps in caring for their mental health. YouHQ is a safe space where support, resources and community come together to promote a healthier mind.

Students use their Google login details, and it allows our Senior Mental Health Lead, Mrs Varney, to monitor students' mental health and wellbeing, so that early help and intervention can be provided.

YouHQ is a multi-functioning wellbeing and personal development tool which enables schools to:

- Accurately assess whole school wellbeing and highlight students who may need more support, through validated built-in surveys and youHQ FOCUS feature
- Teach students the skills to enhance personal development and wellbeing 24/7 with our catalogue of resources
- Facilitate and improve teacher-to-student relationships
- Report wellbeing-related safeguarding concerns
- Improve parent-school relationships through our snapshot termly reports.

MINDFULNESS & MEDITATION LIFE COACH

In school we have a number of support structures to help our students. On Monday, Alesha from <u>Teen Health</u> comes into school and appointments can be made by emailing Mrs Varney <u>vvarney@brookvalegroby.com</u>

On Tuesday and Wednesday we have a mindfulness and meditation life coach, Sandy. Sandy works with small groups of students, supporting them to develop their own coping strategies, for example if they are experiencing anxiety or depression. If you feel that your child would benefit, please email Vicki Varney vvarney@brookvalegroby.com to get added to the list. The group sessions take place during the school day on a rotation, so that the same lesson is not affected each week.

Additionally, we would like to share that in partnership with the NHS, Vita Health Group provide Talking Therapies services to adults 16-years and over, who live and are registered with a GP in Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland. More details can be found on the website here.

SAFEGUARDING INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

As a campus we give the highest priority to safeguarding our children and young people in all aspects of their school and college lives. This means that staff and volunteers must be alert to possible concerns about every student, and to report these in a proper fashion. The campus has a safeguarding and child protection policy which parents/carers can view on our website; www.brookvalegroby.com

In order to effectively safeguard all students and adults on site it is important that all visitors to school, including parents and carers, sign in at reception before they go anywhere else. All adults on the campus are asked to challenge any adults that they see on site who are not wearing identification which indicates that they have signed in at reception. Please do not go directly to the Groby building or any other part of the campus without first going to reception in the Brookvale building.

It is important for parents to be aware that:


- Staff and volunteers in the campus have a duty to report concerns about a child, whether this means the child may be in need of
 additional support or help of some kind or whether it is thought that a child may have been abused or be at risk of abuse.
- In some cases the campus is obliged to refer children to children's social care staff, for children to be assessed for their needs or if an investigation into possible child abuse is required.
- In many cases there will already have been discussions between campus staff and the parents/carers of the child, and the situation and concerns will not be a surprise to them. However, parents may not be told that the campus has referred their child to children's social care if it is thought that this might put the child at risk.
- Children's social care tries to carry out its enquiries in a sensitive fashion. It has to gather information and generally it can be open with parents about the steps being taken.
- If you think your child may have been abused, or may be at risk, you should contact the children's social care office. If you think the abuse may have happened on campus, contact the Headteacher or the Designated Senior Person for Child Protection, who is Mr Godwin, Senior Deputy Headteacher. If you think your child has been hurt, arrange to visit your doctor. Comfort and reassure your child.
