

Aylesbury High School Mufti Day Dress Code

The following guidelines have been put together following requests from students in Student Voice meetings. We appreciate there will be more informality in the dress that is worn on mufti days compared to the usual school uniform.

- Outdoor clothes (eg coats, thick scarves, hats, gloves) should not be worn in and around school
- A head covering is permitted for religious reasons. The student's face should be visible at all times
- No unnatural hair colouring is allowed
- Facial and body jewellery is not to be worn in school, with the exception of stud earrings in the ear lobe
- Subtle make up is allowed
- Blouses/shirts/t-shirts/jackets should have a reasonably high neckline
- Sleeveless tops are acceptable as long as straps are at least 6cm wide: spaghetti straps and bra tops are not permitted. No clothing should reveal bare midriffs
- Skirts and shorts should be of an appropriate length and not be excessively short or revealing (if you hold your arms by your side with your fingers stretched out, your skirt or shorts should be at least as long as this)
- Footwear should be sufficient to allow you to move around buildings safely, eg flip-flops should not be worn
- Denim can be worn
- Leggings are allowed
- Clothing that has slogans which may cause offence to others may not be worn
