


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Welcome

Dear Parents/Carers and Students

Aylesbury High School's aim is: To Inspire every student to seek Challenge, realise their potential and Prepare for the world of today and tomorrow. We believe that this message of 'Prepare, Challenge and Inspire' runs throughout the school and we hope will become your 'motto for life'.

As the only girls' grammar in North Buckinghamshire, we believe there are real benefits from this single sex education. These include feeling more comfortable in non-traditional subjects, less pressure to conform to gender stereotypes and gaining greater confidence. This is only one side to our story and the geographical advantage of having our brother school, AGS, literally across the road means that our students have a greater social group than elsewhere. Shared experiences include language exchanges and annual joint drama production, as well as music events, visiting speakers and curriculum opportunities; truly the 'best of both'. Your final joint event is an AHS/AGS Year 13 prom, currently held at Missenden Abbey.

Our academic success is long-established and even though we are often ranked in the best schools in the country and the country, we are a school that constantly looks to improve. This is reflected in the hard work and dedication of our staff, as well as the engagement of our students. There is no doubt that our students are our greatest ambassadors and I sum this up as 'Our results speak for themselves, our students speak for us'.

I am committed to preparing our students for 'the tests of life, rather than a life of tests' and see our academic excellence as one of three facets we offer:

Our wide ranging curriculum (around 25 subjects at both GCSE and A-level) is supported by a wealth of co-curricular opportunities. These include team and individual activities, sports (we are in the top 5 state schools in both 2018 and 2019) and the creative and performing arts, all of which are hosted in the excellent facilities of AHS, AGS or the neighbouring Chilterns. Whatever our students' interests, we aim to cater for them.

Ofsted always comment on our students' outstanding personal development and we play an active role in the local, national and international communities, leading, motivating and caring for others. Ski trips, Duke of Edinburgh Award, Dance trips, World Challenge Expeditions, our Year 8 trip to Aberdyfi and subject Field Trips have meant that our students have travelled to 4 continents in the past few years and we look forward to getting back to that as travel restrictions ease.

Students flourish if they feel safe, motivated and valued. We have placed well-being and inclusivity at the heart of all we do and believe our student support and welfare is outstanding. This support is provided by dedicated, professional staff and other student ambassadors that receive accredited external training.

Join us and Settle in

Starting secondary school is a big step and we do all that we can to aid the transition process. We aim to visit every Year 6 student in the summer term before she starts at AHS in September. The induction programme commences in July when students spend two days here; they meet teachers and their tutor group, and consequently feel confident about starting in September.

A significant number of students also join the school in Year 12 and they too are encouraged to visit and meet us. After completing their GCSEs, they attend an induction day in the summer where the focus is on meeting fellow students, team building and making the first step to becoming a member of our Sixth Form. Students joining other year groups are also encouraged to visit prior to taking up a place and their Head of Year ensures that they have a structured start.

A strong system of support exists for students at all times; each student is a member of a tutor group and is looked after by a Form Tutor who takes a special interest in her progress and welfare. A Head of Year oversees each year group. Student Ambassadors, a peer support system, is run by specially trained students for students and we also have the services of a student welfare co-ordinator.

We consider parental involvement to be of vital importance. We keep in close touch with parents through our home-school e-mail system, newsletters from the Headteacher, our website, annual written subject reports, regular checks on progress and through the student planner. Equally, parents are encouraged to keep in touch with us and are welcome in school at any time. Parents are also invited to support the work of the school by joining the very active parents' association.

All visitors to the school comment on our superb facilities including:


- Appropriately equipped specialist teaching rooms and modernised science labs

- A dedicated language suite with two state-of-the art computer rooms and support from foreign language assistants who conduct conversation lessons

The school has very successful associations with a number of local organisations including the highly acclaimed Aylesbury Music Centre (located on our site), The Vale Federation of Special Schools and Aylesbury Youth Action.


We are designated as the Teaching School for Aylesbury Vale, which means that we will co-ordinate initial teaching training and support schools in the local area.

Although we are committed to girls' education, there are plenty of opportunities for students to work and socialise with boys. Being adjacent to the boys' grammar school, there are a number of joint initiatives including some shared courses in the Sixth Form, joint visits/exchanges to France, Germany, Spain and Italy, concerts and theatrical productions, and other social occasions - the highlight of which is the Year 13 Leavers' Ball.

Learn to Lead and Experience the World

By the time a student leaves AHS, she will have the necessary qualifications and be able to face future challenges with confidence and ambition.

As soon as a student enters the school, we encourage her to participate in activities and to take on the leadership of some of them.

Typically, she will take part in assemblies and performances, provide entertainment for her peers, parents and members of the local community, take part in charity fund-raising events, get involved in school clubs, House activities and community activities, achieve a Duke of Edinburgh Award, go on a visit in this country, take part in a trip abroad and be able to compare life in this country with a wide range of other countries within Europe and beyond.

An undoubted highlight is the Year 8 residential week where students have the opportunity to really put themselves to the test and develop both personally and as a member of a team.

The very popular House system offers great opportunities for students to participate and lead on the sports field, on the stage, as an artist, or as a cook, to name but a few. We always welcome suggestions for new events from our students.
