

We seek a full-time classroom teacher with a genuine interest in teaching Religious Studies who is able to engage our highly motivated students. You need to be enthusiastic, flexible, capable and willing to participate in a quest for excellence with students who pursue their curiosity through analysing and challenging ideas. The successful candidate would be expected to teach Religious Studies to well-mannered, able and motivated students at all years throughout the school. The post would suit an Early Careers Teacher or a more experienced teacher.

We are achieving pleasing results in all Key Stages, and presently have exam classes in all years at Key Stage 4 and 5. Religious Studies is taught throughout the school, and is also offered as an option for GCSE, and A level. At Key Stage 4, Core RE is currently taught as part of the Personal and Social Education programme. We follow the Buckinghamshire Agreed Syllabus which, at KS3 involves a systematic study of Christianity, Islam, Buddhism and Judaism, with Philosophy and Ethics units on What it means to be Human, the Nature of the Soul, Moral Decision Making, Ultimate Questions and the Problem of Evil. KS4 core RE focuses on Alternative Religions in Y10 and Philosophy and Ethics in Film in Y11. We follow AQA Option A Christianity and Islam for GCSE and at A Level we use AQA and again Christianity is our chosen religion.

As a department, Religious Studies is focusing more on resource-based learning, building in greater differentiation that will allow all students to develop ideas and attitudes at their own pace, as well as bringing their own personal experience to the work they produce. We aim to enthuse and excite students about the spiritual and religious dimensions of life. Courses focus on both learning about and learning from religion. The department has two dedicated classrooms, is well resourced, and committed to a variety of teaching methods in order to make the most of the time available to us.

Team members share the workload across all year groups to retain a whole-school subject overview and a sense of progression. At A Level, staff share the seven or eight lessons per fortnight, each focusing on different modules. Team members will be responsible for particular courses and their resources, together with specific development targets and their action plans.

The successful candidate will have a love of Religious Studies, be able to contribute to the team's aim to foster an interest and enjoyment in the subject and be able to present lessons in an exciting and stimulating way appropriate to the development of each individual student. In addition to enjoying classroom teaching, they will be a good organiser.
