

They are great for collaboration. Here we are all working on one presentation.



- Strongly encouraged
- Discounts for PP students
- Request for Financial Assistance
- Daily loan option from library
- If you already have your own, it must meet the spec (UK and 4GB RAM) and you will need to purchase an AHS license and your own insurance
- It must be a Chromebook (not laptop or Macbook)

- No Excess
- Cover includes Accidental Damage, Theft, Flood Damage, Fire Damage, Malicious Damage
- * Worldwide cover up to 90 days in a 12 month period
- * Automatic reinstatement after a successful claim
