



Will I get my choices?

- \star Yes, probably. There are no pre-timetabled option blocks at AHS
- ★ Rarely, some combinations are impossible
- ★ Changes get harder the later they are made: research now!
- ★ If classes are oversubscribed, we prioritise the main MFL, Humanity and Creative choices over the Additional Choice and we would also ask students who have selected similar subjects such as Business and Economics to choose just one of these.
- \star If a class is still oversubscribed after this is taken into account, we will take applications in the order they are submitted on the Google Form.
