Language Scrapbook

Across your first year of A Level English Language you will be expected to be exploring language use in the world around you. As such, we require you to create and annotate a scrapbook of "real" everyday language.

During the summer, look out for any interesting snippets of language from a range of different sources - newspaper clippings, tickets, advertisements, posters on walls, etc - and start collating these. You can either collect the physical copy (if you have permission!) or take a photo and add to a Word or Google document. You can make notes about the language being used, key phrases that stand out to you or summarising why you found the snippet interesting.

But please **do NOT buy** a scrapbook just yet! We will be going over this in September.
