OUR VISION

Care and Education with a Purpose

A HIGH-QUALITY EARLY YEARS EDUCATION IS VITALLY IMPORTANT. CHILDREN ATTEND EARLY YEARS PROVISION AT A CRUCIAL DEVELOPMENTAL POINT IN THEIR LIVES. THE EDUCATION AND CARE THAT THEY RECEIVE AFFECTS NOT ONLY FUTURE EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT BUT ALSO THEIR FUTURE HEALTH AND HAPPINESS.

'Bold beginnings' underpins our philosophy from birth to 5 years and is central to our developments throughout our rooms in our nursery.

We explore literature relating to early years education, drawing on a range of sources, including academic and policy literature, reflect on practice and support staff professional development to ensure a high-quality early education in present in all of our rooms.

We consider and discuss the following as a senior leadership team and staff teams in each room to ensure the best for all:

- the early years indoor and outdoor enabling environment
- staffing in each room
- early years curriculum and pedagogy

A high-quality early education can prepare children for success in their later education. During their early education, children begin to explore the building blocks of national curriculum subjects that they will go on to study. The 'Effective provision of pre-school primary and secondary education' study found that children who attended pre-school provision, of any kind, attained higher total GCSE scores than those who did not. Importantly to note is that your decision to send your child to a quality pre-school provision such as our Nursery, where you support us with good attendance patterns and effective partnership, is the foundation to enabling your child to fulfil their potential now and in the future.





OUR CURRICULUM

At Bensham Grove Community Nursery School the children have a broad balanced curriculum on offer in all rooms. We underpin all we do with positive adult:child interactions where a language rich communication approach is taken at every opportunity. 'Language is learnt in the give and take of daily interactions and conversations.'

We have introduced a programme of professional development for our staff called 'Launchpad for Literacy'. This is all about children, the skills they have and the skills they need for all aspects of literacy. It is a systematic, skill-based approach, enabling staff to:

- improve outcomes in the Early Years and beyond by creating firm foundations and a broad base of Literacy readiness beyond our setting.
- identify speech, language and other developmental needs as soon as possible and to embed specific skillbased intervention into practice through play.

Our staff development focus for both our training days and half termly meetings utilises this approach to continue to embed, reflect and improve our work with our children.

OUR APPROACH TO POSITIVE RELATIONSHIPS

As part of our priority to ensure all children and families feel represented in our Nursery community we are aiming to work towards 'The School of Sanctuary Award'. This is given in recognition of good practice in fostering a safe and inclusive environment, building understanding and empathy towards people seeking safety and working collaboratively to strengthen community approaches to welcoming all families. We feel it works well alongside our inclusion and diversity curriculum that we do with our children and supports the CPD of the staff team to ensure all policies and procedures are line with our vision. We look forward to sharing the progress of this insightful nursery school improvement area.

SUMMARY OF THE AUTUMN TERM

BENSHAM GROVE NURSERY SCHOOL AT DECKHAM

We have had a lovely Autumn term at Deckham. In September we welcomed lots of new children into nursery, and they have settled wonderfully; exploring the environment, learning routines and forming friendships. The seasonal autumn and winter changes have provided lots of exciting learning opportunities. Outdoors, the children have been noticing changes in the environment, hunting for minibeasts, and raking leaves and then using our new wheelbarrows to transport the leaves around the outdoor area.

We have also brought natural materials into the indoor environment to provide learning opportunities. The children used leaves to make collage pictures, inspired by the story 'Leaf Man'. They used pinecones with balancing scales to explore the concept of weight. Our older children created repeating patterns with conkers and coloured leaves. These were just a few of the ways in which children used 'autumn treasures' within their learning and play.

This term we shared special experiences through talking about how the children celebrated Halloween, and through learning about Bonfire Night and Diwali. In November we enjoyed welcoming families into nursery for our 'Stay and Play' sessions. These sessions provided a lovely opportunity for the children to work collaboratively with family members and to share some of their favourite areas and resources with them.

Sharing books together is a fantastic way to build vocabulary, learn about rhythm and rhyme, develop imagination and enjoy beautiful stories together. We have enjoyed sharing some lovely books this term, and the children have developed their understanding of the stories through play opportunities and first hand experiences, for example, creating houses for Goldilocks and the Three Bears, and making and tasting their own porridge.

We cannot wait to welcome everyone back in the new year alongside many new children and families who will be starting their journey with us. There will also be some new faces within our expanding staff team to offer the best learning experience to all of our children.

To all of the children and families we hope everyone has a lovely festive holiday and we are looking forward to the next term together at Deckham.

SUMMARY OF THE AUTUMN TERM

We started the Autumn term by welcoming many new starters across our rooms at Bensham. We supported these children helping them adjust to new routines and larger learning environments. The learning environment in each room allows for and facilitates children to take greater steps in independent learning and staff are always on hand to help children to adjust to changes in the outdoor and indoor learning environments. The transition to each new space is always well planned by the team and considerations for each child is discussed in detail to support this as effectively as possible. Our staff team cannot believe how quick this term has gone by. It has been lovely to see how the new children have settled this term and reflect back on all of the events and experiences we have explored.

We would like to thank all of the parents and carers who were able to join us with the various events we have held this half term with 'Stay and Play' and our 'Singalong'. Within our curriculum we have explored experiences around Children in Need, Road Safety, Remembrance, Halloween, Bonfire Night, Diwali, Christmas and Nursery Rhyme Week and so many more!

In the Discovery Hub the staff team are so impressed with the all the children who are making lovely progress in learning and relationships between peers and our staff team. Over the term they have engaged with many core books and songs of the weeks which the children have loved joining in with. They have had many outdoor experiences as the weather begins to change and some love autumnal walks to the community gardens.

Our smallest children have loved our outings in our new quadruple buggies enabling them to communicate and socialise together whilst enjoying the outdoors. The children in both the Nest and the Den have enjoyed the focus on quality story time and their sustained focus on books and rhymes is beyond expectations for this age phase! They have engaged with so many connections with the seasons often with amazing fun sensory activities where the pleasure on their face is a gift to see! The children explored pumpkins in a range of ways like painting them and feeling the pumpkin insides. Our babies have enjoyed a range of sensory activities, exploring and developing vital skills, such as fine motor skill and hand eye coordination. They have loved listening to songs, rhymes and stories, showing engagement and curiosity. They continue to amaze us with their sense of fun and curiosity; all characteristics that will enable them to be successful learners in the future!

It has been a lively and productive first term in the Investigation Hub! This year, they have implemented a slightly different timetable with small group focus time at the start of the day before our plan-doreview sessions. It has been amazing to see the children starting their days with such high engagement in their small group tasks. The children have visited forest school and the garden regularly and have observed the Autumnal changes with the falling leaves and changing weather. In the winter months they have played in the snow, observed and investigated the ice and thought about how to take care of our resident birds during this season.
