#### KS1 Reading and Phonics



Our whole school focus this year is to support our children to become fluent readers. What do we mean by fluency? In the context of literacy, reading fluency is defined as reading with accuracy (reading words correctly), automaticity (reading words at an appropriate speed without great effort) and prosody (appropriate stress and intonation). Fluency is not simply about the speed with which you read a book.

# How do we teach phonics in Key Stage One?

#### Daily Phonics Lessons

- Children learn to read and write words using new sounds.
- Children are taught to read and write tricky words.



#### 66 Phonics is:

making connections between the sounds of our spoken words and the letters that are used to write them down.



# How do we teach reading in books?




Reading practice sessions are:

timetabled three times a week

taught by a trained

teacher/teaching assistant

taught in small groups.










#### Reading at Home



your child will take home a phonics based reading book every week. This book will be carefully selected to match their individual progress. Your child should be able to read 95% of the book fluently (e.g. only need to decode 1 word out of 10.) We encourage you to share this book again and again and again with your child until they are reading it fluently and confidently.
