Mobile phones - never used, seen or heard

As outlined in my update letter in July, we have made a change to our mobile phone policy which we are confident will increase our focus on learning. Following consultation with students, from September, our policy for students will be that they are able to keep possession of their mobile phones on the strict condition that they are never used, seen or heard anywhere on the school premises or grounds. This is one of the recommended DfE approaches and reflects work that we have done with the Behaviour Hub.

If a mobile phone is used, seen or heard then it will be confiscated, stored in the Office and may be collected at the end of the day. If a phone is confiscated three times then an afterschool detention will be issues and, if this is repeated, then the student in question will be asked to hand their phone in on their arrival at school and collect it at the end of the day.

We appreciate that there may be occasions where you may need to contact your child through the day and, if so, then you should call the Main Office on 01423 323540 or e-mail at schooladmin@boroughbridgehigh.com If your child needs to contact you, then they may go to the School Office or to a member of the Pastoral Team at break or lunchtime.

Our tools for improvement this year

Whilst we are delighted with the progress that we have made, we are well aware that we are only part of the way on our improvement journey. This year the introduction of our learning expectations in each of the Phases of Learning has been one of our key vehicles in driving up standards of behaviour and learning in the classroom.
