- We will be inviting in employers, training providers, colleges and 6th forms to come in and meet the students and help them learn more about the world of work and education.
- Regular career updates via the school newsletter and specialist career newsletter editions at key times of the year.

I met all the Yr. 10 students in an Assembly on Friday 13th June to explain this and to tell them about our first event in this programme which is the school's interactive careers event with employers on Thursday 19th June (see below)

Support for you – Parents and carers play a key role in their teenager's decisions and the school is keen to involve you throughout the year and keep you informed about what is happening. You will receive support to help your teenager make choices that work for them. You will receive further information re open days at colleges, training providers and sixth forms at the beginning of the new school year.
