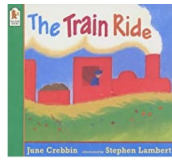
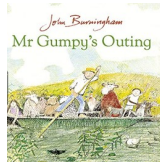

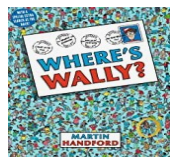

In **Year 1**, the children have been enjoying the 'Where's Wally' books and 'The Secret Sky Garden'

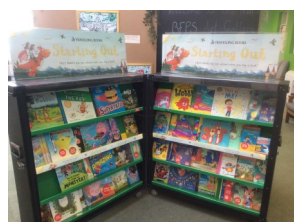


Year 2 have

Thank you to all those who came and supported the Book fair this year. We raised over £400! This means the school will have some of this money to spend on quality books for the classrooms. Thank you!



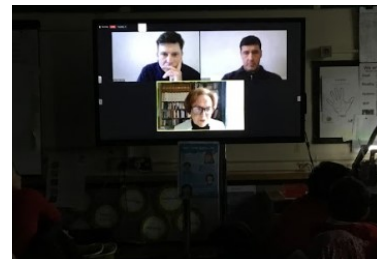

As always well done to our latest lucky prize draw winners each receiving a lovely brand new book!

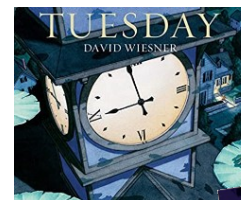
KS2: Another jam-packed half-term full of author news, stories and wonderful books!

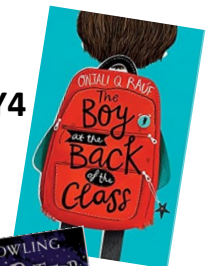


Books that have been enjoyed in KS2 as 'Class read alouds' this term...

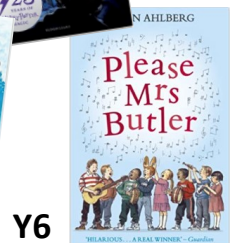

World Book Day is a **charity** on a mission to help change children's lives by making reading together and reading for pleasure a habit for life. **Reading for pleasure is the single biggest indicator for success in life, more than family circumstances, educational background, or income.**



- **I wonder...**

Ask open questions about how characters are feeling or what might happen next or why things are in the illustration.

- **Bring the book to life...**

Make faces, use voices, include actions – have fun together!

- **That reminds me of...**

Make personal connections.

- **What have you seen there?**

Follow their interests.

- **That's made me feel...**

Let your child know how the events of the story have affected you.

- **Oo look at that!**

Let them know what you have noticed.

- **Again, again...**

Re-reading is a great source of comfort for children– and a chance to spot things that you didn't see first time round. Challenge yourself to spot something new each time.

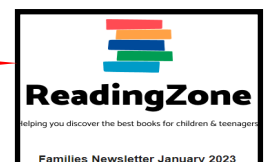
