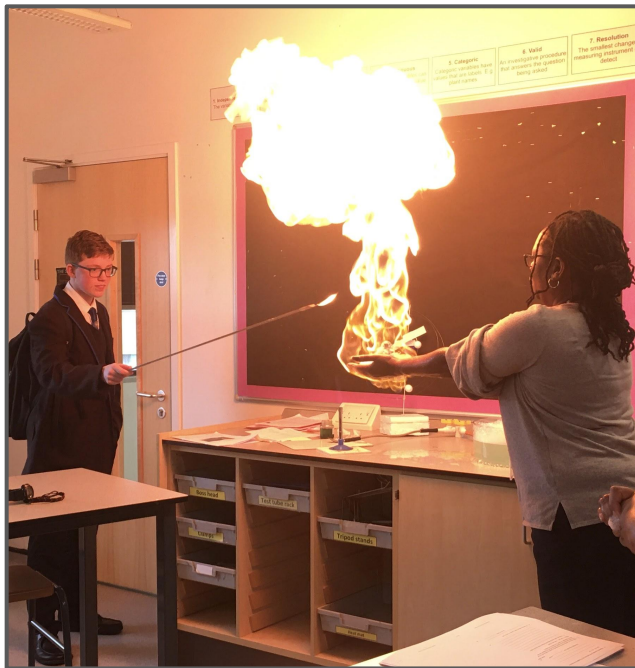
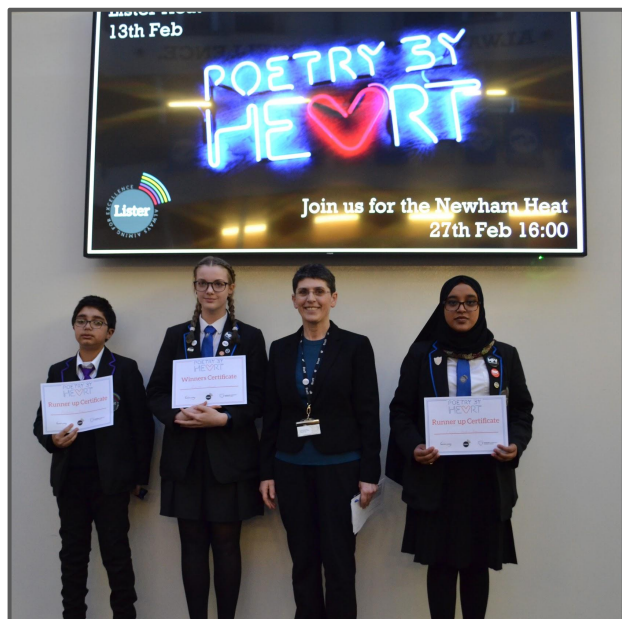

Newham **Recorder** Pupils' video project helping emergency and bus services to be more 'deaf aware'



Deaf students from Lister School launch deaf awareness campaign for buses and emergency services

A group of deaf students from the Lister Community School in Plaistow have launched new resources to help Newham's buses and emergency services be more deaf aware, thanks to a grant from the National Deaf Children's Society.

The project was the brainchild of six deaf students: Nathan Graham-Oshinowo, 12, Delali Latzoo, 13, Claudia Nechita, 12, Samit Noor, 13, Nadia Patwary, 14, and Rayyan Shahid, 11, who all attend Lister Community School.

The group wants to show hearing people how to communicate more quickly and effectively with deaf people in Newham. They are starting with the bus service because they rely on bus drivers to help them get where they want to go. The group will then move on to working with the police, ambulance and fire services because good communication is vital if ever they are called upon to help.

The inspiration for the group's project came from the experience of a deaf friend of Nadia, who kept missing her stop on the borough's buses because she couldn't hear the driver.

After a visit to the school by the National Deaf Children's Society's Roadshow in May 2019, the students secured a grant of £500 from the charity's Make a Change Fund, enabling them to realise their plans.

The group now have the green light to film a deaf awareness video for Newham's bus drivers, as well as one each for the borough's police, ambulance and fire services, helping these services tackle some of the issues they may encounter when communicating with deaf people going about their daily lives as well as at times of emergency.

Next month the group will film their video for bus drivers and are hopeful of finishing all four videos in the coming months.

Throughout this week, we had various competitions and activities run by staff and students. The aim was to shine a spotlight on languages and consider their importance.

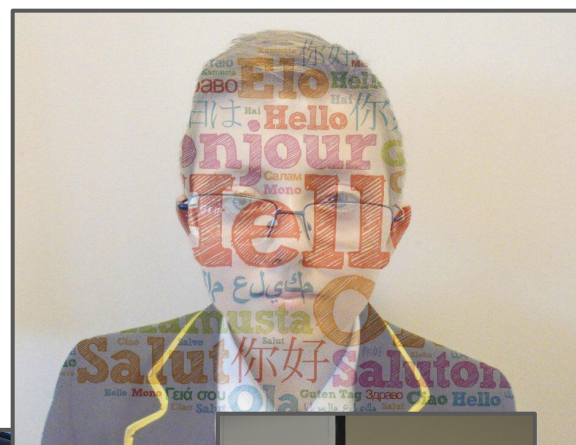

This week was able to teach both students and teachers about how languages can unlock a whole new world and allow you to not only achieve more in life but also allow yourself to make new friends by sharing the same language.

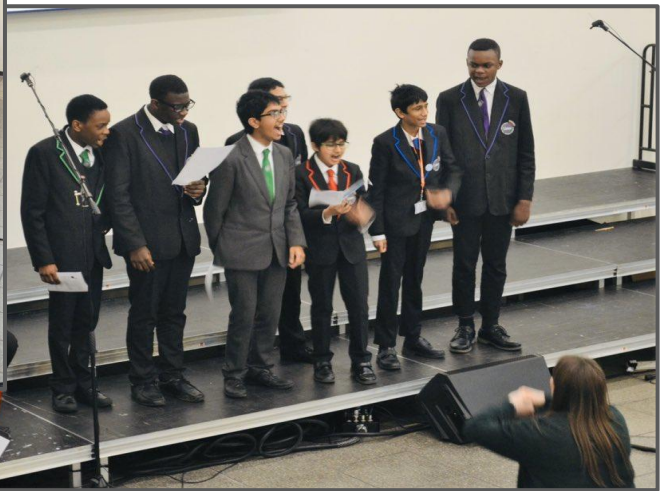
Lister's Languages Week was absolutely amazing and we can't wait for it again next year!!

The aim of the Programme is to prepare students for college and university application processes and supports students in looking forward to ensure that, when the time comes, they will have an abundance of knowledge to create the best applications possible. The Programme culminates in a residential to Oxford University where students will gain first hand experience of university life!

Careers opportunities for our students

The Lister Careers team organise a fantastic range of learning experiences for students in all year groups. Here are just a few highlights.



To celebrate the hard work and good attitude of particular students 30 students across Year 7 -10 were chosen to attend **WE day** in Wembley arena. This is a very fun and exciting event that allows students to celebrate the impact they have made on local and global issues through speeches made by celebrities and musical performances!

From September 2019 to January 2020 15 Year 10 students and 2 Year 11 students came together for a social action project run by **Headstart Action**- Young Green Apprentice. The social action project they worked on was setting up food banks in school and at Lendlease Stratford. Once all the food had been collected they went to deliver it to a local home for the homeless in Plaistow. To celebrate everything they had achieved Headstart Action invited them to a celebration evening at **City Hall** where our students were able to explain to many different businesses in Canary Wharf what they had been doing for the past 5 months.



30 Year 9 students were chosen to take part in a short **ViY Mentoring course**. Students attended two workshops where they were taught the basics of DIY. Students were then taken to **Applecarts Arts** in Plaistow where they were able to decorate one of the halls there. They had a lot of fun painting silhouettes in the main hall and sanding down the walls in the corridors.

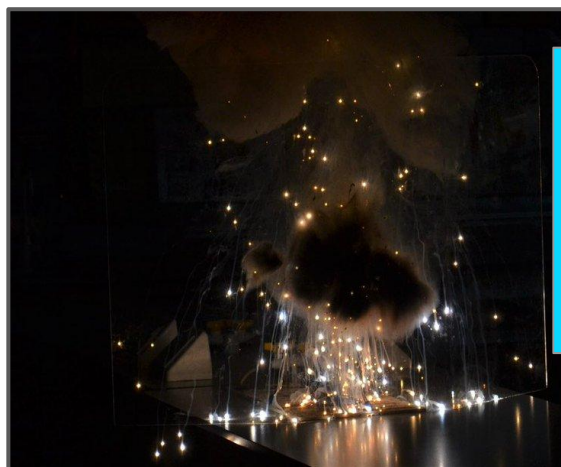
Some time was also spent on discussing the use of a multi faith prayer room- students felt that space ought to be made for different faith groups to be able to book a space for the observations of various faith practices.

Head Students and Deputy Head students will discuss these recommendations with Mr Wilson.

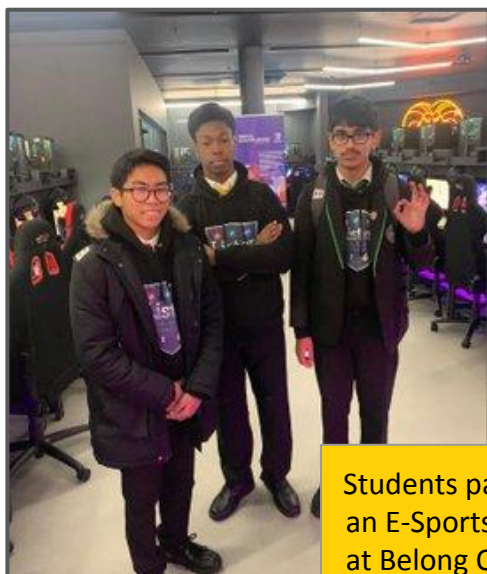

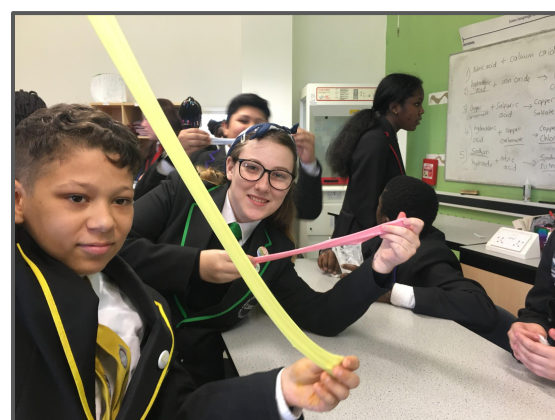

British Science Week featured slime making, explosions, DNA extractions and much more!



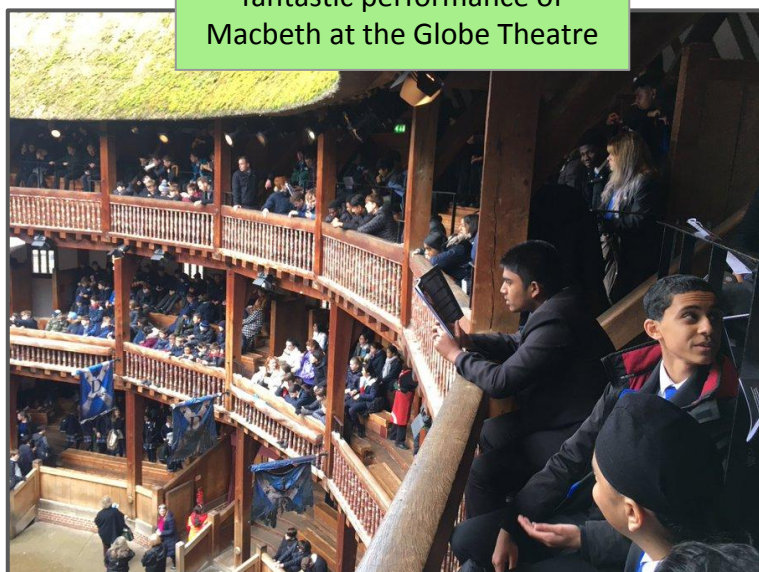

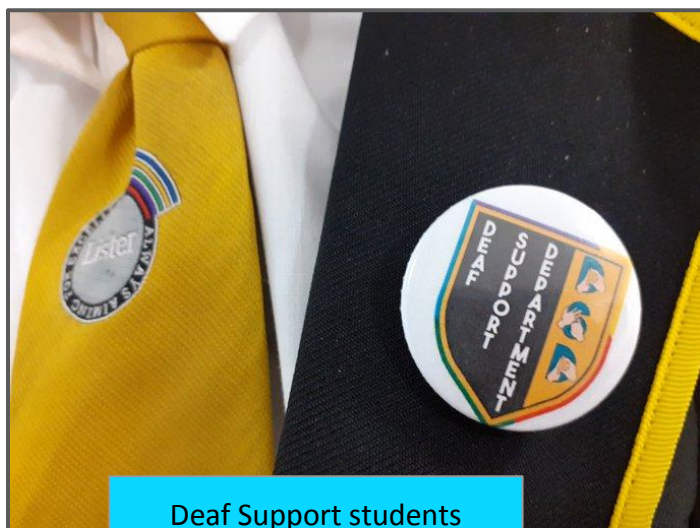
