Illness and supporting our immune systems

We seem to be having lots of poorly children at the minute. We know that many of us are struggling to boost our immune systems, so it's extremely important that pupils are looking after themselves. Here's some examples...

- Vitamin supplements for children
- Lots of sleep/ early bedtimes
- Lots of fruit and vegetables

Food for Thought...

50% of our school have missed between 5% and 10% of their education this year.

This could have a detrimental impact on pupils mental health and well being if it continues, as pupils are missing out on being with friends and vital learning.

Please support us in our drive to have more pupils in school this term.

How many days off can pupils have if poorly....?

To achieve **97%**, this equates to *no more than 6 days off per school year*. We share with the children that we should try and only take these days when we are really poorly.

Meetings

If your child's attendance is classed as serious (below 90%) or concern (between 90-95%), it might be that we invite you into school so that together we can discuss ways to improve your child's attendance.

We are here to help!

EWO referral

Unfortunately, if you do not attend your meeting, we will refer this to the Education Welfare Officer at the council, who will arrange to come and meet you in the home and could potentially lead to fixed penalty notices being issued if we don't see an improvement.
