

Character Growth (Crew)

During Summer Term 2, we are really focussing in on our HoWL 'Be Kind'.

At Carcroft School, as well as expecting our pupils to work hard in order to get smart, we expect pupils to be kind to one another. We understand that not everyone is going to be 'friends' with everyone, however, we expect everyone to be kind and show respect towards one another within our school community and this is a non- negotiable.

We have noticed during the last few months during conversations with parents that at times, children are being unkind towards one another and this is being referred to as 'being bullied'.

Bullying is defined below.

What is bullying?

Bullying is behaviour that hurts someone else. It includes name calling, hitting, pushing, spreading rumours, threatening or undermining someone.

It can happen anywhere – at school, at home or online. It's usually repeated over a long period of time and can hurt a child both physically and emotionally.







Character Growth (Crew)

At Carcroft School, we take any concerns around bullying seriously and appreciate it when parents share their concerns with us so that these can be looked into.

We have found over recent months that when a concern has been raised that often the concerns are linked to a child being *unkind* towards someone else and when addressed the child has not meant to cause harm to others and it has not been over a period of time. However, this is still no okay and we need to address unkind behaviour.

Therefore, this term, we are going to spend time within our crew sessions talking about how we treat one another at our school and that we do not tolerate unkind behaviour. Mrs Atherton is also going to lead some key stage community meetings to talk about how we treat one another both in and out of school.

If you ever feel that your child is being subject to unkind actions/ or you believe they are being bullied, please do not hesitate to raise this with your Child's Teacher. If you feel that this is still ongoing please then speak with your child's Phase Leader.

These pupils have been selected for producing beautiful work this week. We are really focussing on consistent presentation in every piece of work.







Applying speech in MI
