

















Y1

Wider Curriculum...

In addition to building Crew this week, Miss Shields (our Art and DT Lead) set us some art challenges so that we could practise some of our art skills.

We linked our art skills to building crew and used our critique skills to support us to evaluate the process and our work.

F1 (EYFS)

Art - Learning to make our mark!

During Crew week we all worked together to make a large Crew Dorman art print using our hands! We explored primary colours,red, blue and yellow and talked about how the colours mixed together. We also used our art time to talk about what made us happy!



Crew Robson and Crew Godley have been working hard, to get smart today by creating their own colour wheels using their art skills. We will be using our background knowledge to create a piece of crew art work tomorrow – watch this space!

We began by exploring what a colour wheel is and how we can vary shades and tints of colours by adding black or white. We were amazed by the children's resilience and determination to achieve the desired effect.









Today we completed our art project, printing! Over the last 3 days we have carefully designed our print, crafted the template and then printed it onto card. First we had to think about the design, something to represent us and our hobbies. We then meticulously added the string to our template, making sure we followed our design and had the string in the right places. Finally, we then painted the string on the design and printed it onto card. The results are fantastic and really show how hard Crew Thompson worked and concentrated. Well done!























Today we carried on with our art learning. Children had to create their printing block based on their interests. They'd been asked to create an image that represents them. It was lovely seeing some of the children supporting their peers when they'd completed their own. Then it was time to print which required children to work quickly and carefully. It's important to not allow the paint to dry otherwise the print would be unsuccessful. We discussed how we could improve if we were to complete the project again. Children suggested making their images bigger or using more paint which would allow a clearer image.



We also started our art work on printing. We discussed lots of things about ourselves then used this in our art work to create a picture that represents us. We created a key where different shapes represented different things about ourselves. We then printed our shapes using different colours and we also tried to layer our shapes in different ways.

Academic Success- Reading

Narrative for Success...

At Carcroft School and XP Trust, we work through our narrative for success in order for our pupils to be the best version of themselves.

- 1. Are our children **safe?** Both in school and at home.
- 2. Once we know that children feel safe, we can support them to **engage** in coming to school.
- 3. Once they enjoy coming to school because they are safe and engaged, we can then need to work together to ensure that they **attend well**.
- 4. Then and only then, can we ensure that they have **good HoWLs.** We can only support them to understand how to be a good or great learner.
- 5. Finally, once they are attending well and achieving good HoWLs, we can support them to achieve their targets set for them in Reading, Writing and Maths and Curriculum. We call this **academic progress**.
