Sharing our Stories as we go...







Reading Book Talk

W/C Monday 2nd October

Just like with any new text, in our first session we focussed on prediction. We used the front cover and blurb to ignite our prediction and generated ideas around what the book may be about. We made connections with films and books we already knew about forests and rainforests, in a lot of these there was a plane crash plot. The connections that we can make before we start reading will help us to predict, engage and understand more of what is happening in the book. Questions we have now help us with engagement as we want to find the answers as we read - Once we've started thinking about these things in a bit more depth, we have more information to make our predictions.

In Book Talk 1, we focussed on vocabulary. Without reading on, we justified our opinion of what would happen in the text. We delved into chapter one *flight* by echo reading with our partner and offering critique based on reading fluently.







The Lungs of Our Earth How Could We Help Our Planet Survive?



In Case Study One, we will be geographers. To allow us to understand the importance of our guiding guestion and whu it matters to us, we will look deeper into what makes up our planet. We will look at continents, oceans and regions of the globe. We will immerse ourselves in the largest rainforest, the Amazon, and its continent of South America. We will focus on Colombia and its human and physical features and compare what we would find with Yorkshire and England. This will then link to the impact of deforestation on the local population and the wider impact on the rest of the world, including how it is changing the

In Case Study Two, we will be scientists and study the animals and plants that live within the Amazon rainforest and the importance of ecosustems in supporting species; we will link this back to England. By understanding the classification and reproduction of animals and plants, we will develop our understanding of the diverse range of living things and how all living things depend on others for their survival. To take our learning further, we will also explore how adaptation helps animals to survive in their ever-changing environments and the dangers of extinction to those that aren't able to adapt quickly enough.

Through our Expedition in writing lessons, we will be authors writing a range of different genres. In Case Study One, we will be writing a recount about our VR rainforest experience, as well as a non chronological report informing tourists about Colombia. During Case **Study Two.** we will be using the film *The Lorax* as a stimulus to produce narrative fiction and support children's understanding of deforestation. In our final Case Study, we will write a monologue from the viewpoint of an endangered rainforest animal, which we will share with you at our POL event!



We will be using our Hooked on Books reading sessions to help us to gain some extra information about natural disasters. These are some of the texts that we will be looking at. You could talk about this with your children. including what the text is about, if it is fiction or non-fiction, who the author and illustrator are and whether they liked reading the book or not. If they are yet to read the book, you could make some predictions together.



In Case Study Three, we will be design technologists. Following our learning on deforestation and the comparisons made to this country, we will look at how deforestation can be managed and benefit areas by using repurposed wood. We will look at the hazards of woodwork and how to keep ourselves safe, including the use of appropriate tools, techniques and the importance of accuracy when measuring and cutting. Using all of that, we will create a frame which we will then be decorate and fill before displaying these in our POL event.

We thought about how we could create our own storyboard of something funny happening and how different sound effects could give those moments a 'slap-stick' feel. We also started thinking about instruments or objects in the classroom that might be able to make that sound.

During recorders, we were introduced to the note A. We looked at where we need to place our fingers before practising call-and-response style activities with Miss McGlone, playing different rhythms of the note A. We then took our new knowledge and played a piece called 'Amazing Aeroplane'. *
