Sharing our Stories as we go...





Prepositional language in FS2

After they learnt the vocabulary, the children built the story using small world resources and showed how the characters moved through the story, using our new vocabulary to describe what they were doing.

We know how important it is for our children to understand the amounts of money, such a crucial life skill. Well done Crew Robson.






Crew MW started their Christmas artwork! The skill we are focussing on is colour mixing... I can see you had lots of fun using your hands to print!


Stunning art pieces from Crew MI. Not only are you focusing on your art but Mrs McClare also said how resilient you all were. Great work!
