#### Sharing our Stories as we go...




- Character Growth

Mrs Elmer explored the front cover of a new text to immerse the children into the text and infer from the front cover what we might expect from the book.

They also explored some of the pictures from the text as an extra stimulus answering questions as a crew... What does it remind us of? What do we think it will be about or is going to happen? What do we wonder? And what do we notice?

They recorded responses during a 'Silent Conversation' to compare individual thoughts with one another afterwards.


#### **Academic Success- Maths**






# Wider Curriculum RE


