

Please can we ask that children are reading their book at home for 10 minutes per day and at least 3 x per week/ ideally 4 times a week.






Reading plus in MI

Y3/4 critiquing double page spread examples before they begin to plan their own report.






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Bar chart maths in Crew MI




Pictogram maths in Crew Hamill.




