Key Information

Our curriculum will be inspired by our Autumn Bookshelf that is filled with exciting, high-quality texts that enable us to centre our curriculum around six different character traits (Bravery, Citizenship, Curiosity, Gratitude, Integrity and Kindness).

School Day

- The school begins at 8.45am and ends at 3.15pm – please aim to have your child ready to enter the school building at 8.45am promptly as we will be starting lessons every day at 8.50am.
- Pupils will have a morning and afternoon break. Their lunchtime is 12.00pm – 1.00pm. The specific time the children will eat their lunch changes slightly each day, based on a weekly rota for the Key Stage.

Practicalities

- Children are provided with a fruit or vegetable snack for playtime each day which is currently funded by the Government.
- Children in Year 2 are still eligible for Universal Infant Free School Meals entitlement. You are of course welcome to send your child in with a packed lunch (please remember nothing in these should include nuts).
- Pupils in Year 2 wear their PE kits in place of regular school uniform on their PE day (day TBC)
- Uniform expectations remain the same as last year – [full guidance on this can be found here](#).

Reading

- School library books will be chosen by your child. They will have the opportunity to swap their books once they have finished reading them.
- Y2 recommended reading books are taken from a selection of age-appropriate texts as part of our reading for pleasure culture. They will be kept for a week and swapped on a Friday.
- Your child will take part in daily whole class reading sessions. Additional reading sessions may be provided should your child require these to enable them to meet age-related expectations. Adults within the team will read with different pupils individually during the week and a note will be recorded in their reading record book.

- We encourage parents/carers to comment in your child's Reading Record book each time you read with them.
- Your child's reading books should be brought into school each day along with their Reading Record book.

Home Learning

- The purpose of Home Learning is to consolidate and extend learning that has taken place in class.
- Children should be able to complete the tasks independently following an initial explanation, but can be supported if required.
- Home learning alternates between Maths/Arithmetic and English/Reading Comprehension and should be completed in your child's Home Learning book. These are sent home on a Friday and are to be handed in each Wednesday.
- Any questions regarding Home Learning should be shared with your child's Class Teacher.
- Other online platforms are available for the children to use either as part of the weekly Home Learning or as additional resources to further embed learning from in school. In Year 2, this includes Spelling Shed, Numbots and Times Tables Rockstars. Logins can be found in the front of your child's Reading Record book.

Home School Communications

- Your child's Class Teacher should always be your first point of contact.
- A member of the Year 2 Team will be available every morning and at the end of the school day. For conversations that may require more time or privacy, please arrange an appointment.
- Reading Records and reading books to be sent home and returned to school daily.
- Parents' Evenings will be scheduled each term, the provisional dates for these will be shared in our Annual Planner in September.
- Feedback can be shared with your child's Class Teacher, Parent Council Representative or one of our Parent Governors.
- Our whole school Weekly Newsletter and Instagram account includes the most up-to-date information for you to read and enjoy throughout the school year.

Drop-off and Collection Arrangements

- The children will enter and leave school via their Year 2 classroom door onto the playground.
- If the person collecting at the end of the day changes, please inform the Admin Team via email or telephone if this changes during the day/at short notice so that the team know who to expect.
