Key Information

Our curriculum will be inspired by our Autumn Bookshelf that is filled with exciting, high-quality texts that enable us to centre our curriculum around six different character traits (Bravery, Citizenship, Curiosity, Gratitude, Integrity and Kindness).

School Day

- The school begins at 8.50am and ends at 3.20pm – please aim to have your child ready to enter the school building at 8.50am promptly as we will be starting lessons every day at 8.55am.
- Pupils will have a morning break. Their lunchtime is 12.30pm – 1.30pm. The specific time the children will eat their lunch changes slightly each day, based on a weekly rota for the Key Stage.
- An example of a typical weekly timetable will be made available in September on the Year 6 page of our website.

Statutory Assessments

Children in Year 6 take part in national Standard Assessment Tests (SATs) in the Summer Term. These tests, alongside teacher assessment of English writing and Science, are used to measure school performance and to make sure individual pupils have the support that they need as they move into secondary school.

The SATs consist of formal assessments in the following areas:

- English reading
- Mathematics
- Grammar, punctuation and spelling

Practicalities

- The teaching team in Year 6 for 2026-27 will comprise of Miss Blomfield, Mr Gillard and Mr Ives. Your child will be taught by all of the Year 6 teaching team (and as such will not have a single named teacher in the sense they may be used to), they will still have a specific classroom that their class will start and end their day in (and will do so in their existing class groups). This base will provide a familiar environment for them and will be the classroom that they are based in for registration.
- Government-funded fruit is not provided for KS2 children. We would encourage you to send a simple, fruit or bread-based snack in for your child to eat during morning break. The following snack choices are allowed: a piece of fruit, raw vegetable sticks, dried fruit or a plain breaded snack. Products containing chocolate are not permitted, nor are products that contain nuts.
- As you are aware, pupils in KS2 do not receive the Universal Infant Free School Meals entitlement. School lunches are available to be purchased every day or you are of course welcome to send your child in with a packed lunch (please remember nothing in these should include nuts). Parents struggling to meet the cost of school lunches may still be entitled to Free School Meals (FSM) – further details about this can be found here: <https://www.gov.uk/apply-free-school-meals>
- Year 6 pupils continue to use lockers, where they can keep their coat and belongings.
- Pupils in Year 6 wear their PE kits in place of regular school uniform on their PE day (day TBC)

Reading

- School reading books will be taken home and your child will have the opportunity to swap their books once they have been read.
- Y6 reading books are taken from a selection of age-appropriate texts as part of our reading for pleasure culture.
- Children take greater ownership for changing their own reading book and time is allocated within the school week and as part of library visits.
- Your child's reading books should be brought into school each day along with their Reading Record book.
- Your child will take part in daily whole class reading sessions. Additional reading sessions may be provided should your child require these to enable them to meet age-related expectations. Adults within the team will read with different pupils individually during the week and a note will be recorded in their reading record book.

Home Learning

- Children should be able to complete the tasks independently following an initial explanation, but can be supported if required.
- Home Learning alternates between Maths/Arithmetic and English/Reading Comprehension and should be completed in your child's Home Learning book. These are sent home on a Friday and are to be handed in by Wednesday the following week.
- Any questions regarding Home Learning should be shared with your child's Class Teacher.
- Other online platforms are available for the children to use either as part of the weekly Home Learning or as additional resources to further embed learning from in school. In Year 6, this includes Spelling Shed, Numbots, Maths bot KS2 arithmetic, White Rose Infinity and Times Tables Rockstars. Logins can be found in the front of the children's Reading Records.

Home School Communications

- One of the Year Group's teachers should always be your first point of contact.
- A member of the UKS2 Team will be available every morning and at the end of every school day. For conversations that may require more time or privacy, please arrange an appointment.
- Reading Records and reading books to be sent home and returned to school daily.
- Parents' Evenings will take place twice throughout the year, the provisional dates for these will be shared in our Annual Planner in September.
- Feedback can be shared with the Year 6 Teachers, Parent Council Representative or one of our Parent Governors.
- Our whole school Weekly Newsletter and Instagram account includes the most up-to-date information for you to read and enjoy throughout the school year.

Drop-off and Collection Arrangements

- Year 6 children will continue to enter through the double doors onto the school playground between the Year 1 and Year 2 classrooms and be dismissed onto the playground through the Year 2 classroom doors.
- If the person collecting at the end of the day changes, please inform the Admin Team via email or telephone if this changes during the day/at short notice so that the team know who to expect.
- If you would like your child to walk home independently, please let the admin team know.
- If your child brings a phone into school with them, then it needs to be turned off before entering the playground and handed in to a Year 6 member of staff at the beginning of the school day so that it can be locked away for the day.
