<u>Key Vocabulary to learn</u>

Great Britain - the island consisting of England, Scotland, and Wales.

London - The capital and largest city of the United Kingdom

Capital city - the city or town where you find a country's government

Newcastle - a city on the north of the river Tyne in the North East of England

United Kingdom or UK - The United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

Human features - in geography human features are things that have been built or made by

humans.

Physical features - Physical features are natural parts of the Earth's landscape that can be seen and touched, such as mountains, rivers, forests, seas, and cliffs.

Aerial photograph - photographs from an elevated position, such as from an aircraft, balloon, or other airborne platform.

Satellite photograph - pictures of Earth taken by a satellite orbiting the planet.

Landmark - A feature of the landscape or area that is easily recognised.
