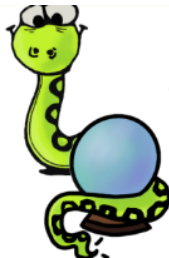

3. How do the descriptions of Marcus Rashford's childhood make the reader feel?



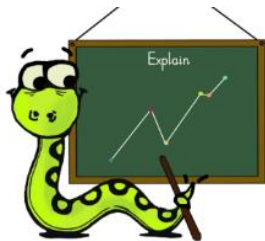

3. Why does he end the book like that? Explain your answer using evidence from the text.

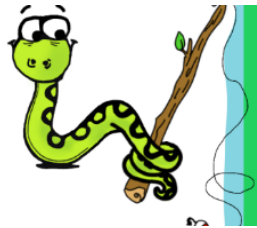

3. What is the main message of the book?

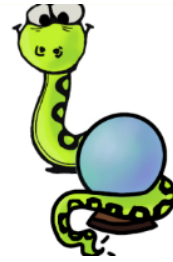

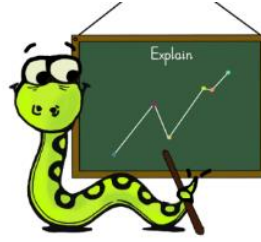

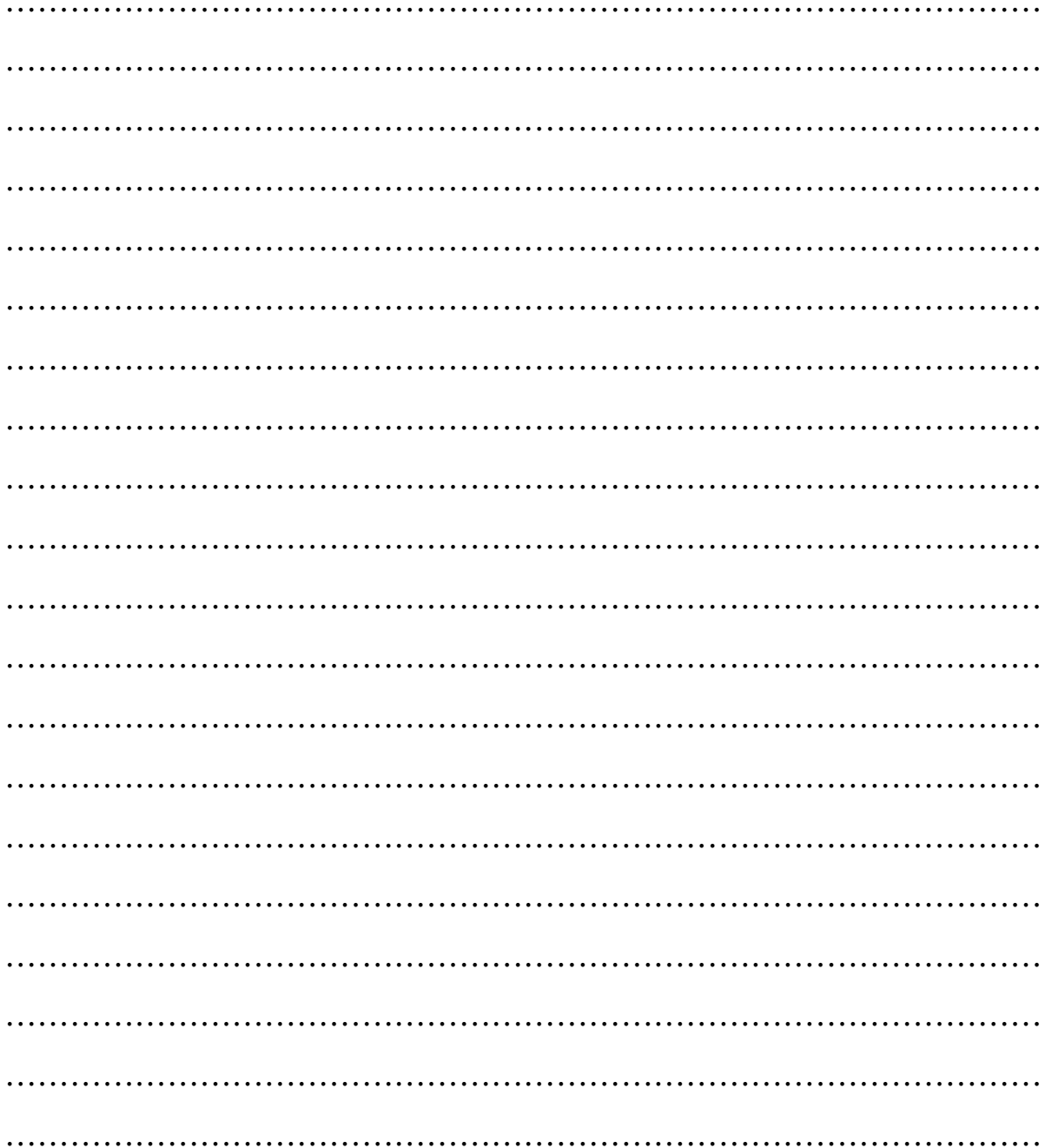
