SEND/SEMH & Inclusion

School Uniform

We would like to thank you in advance for helping us maintain our high standards with regard to uniform; your support is greatly appreciated. If you have any query regarding any point, please do not hesitate to contact the Head of Year 7.

The wearing of college uniform is required at all times. This includes travelling to and from college. All clothing should be clearly marked with your child's name - should your child misplace an item of their uniform, this will help ensure it is returned quickly.

Our college uniform, including our PE kit, is available from Rawcliffes on Roundhay Road, Leeds, telephone 0113 249 4025; and Jo Brand on Harehills Lane, Leeds, telephone 0113 235 1256.

School Blazer

The wearing of the college blazer is compulsory when moving around college, but may be removed in lessons at the discretion of the teacher. The wearing of the college jumper is optional. No other jumper or hoodie is allowed.

Trousers

Trousers and belts are to be plain, black and of a professional style. Fashion trousers and belts are not permitted (this includes skinny-fit, jeans and leggings).



Skirts

Skirts are to be black and knee length and should not have long slits at the side. Skirts which are too short or too tight are not permitted. School skirts must be purchased from our stockists. Tights are to be plain black – not patterned. If socks are worn they are to be plain black.

Shirts

Your child requires a white shirt/blouse that buttons at the collar. This is particularly important as clip-on ties will only attach to a fully buttoned shirt. Students are expected to have their shirt tucked in at all times. Shirts should not be tight.

Ties

All students must wear a clip-on tie at all times.

Coats

Denim jackets, leather coats, hoodies, sweatshirts and any other item of clothing that is not part of our college uniform are not allowed. Coats are not to be worn inside the building.

Shoes

College shoes are to be formal black shoes with a black sole. Any other type of shoe is not allowed (including boots, black trainers, black canvas pumps and backless slip-on).

Hats

Only wooly hats (preferably dark coloured and plain) are permitted during winter months. Hats are not to be worn inside the building.

Hijabs

Only plain black hijabs can be worn.

Jewellery

Wrist watches are allowed. Only one small round gold or silver stud can be worn in each ear. Body piercing is not permissible. Jewellery, such as wrist bands, bangles, bracelets and other such accessories are not permitted. If a student is found with jewellery it will be confiscated and returned at the end of the day. Persistent offenders will have their jewellery confiscated and it will only be returned once parents/carers have made an appointment to meet with the relevant Head of Year.

Make up

Lipstick, eye shadow and eye liner are not allowed. Fake tan and any other similar products, which are clearly visible, are not permitted. Coloured, acrylic or false nails are not permitted. Nails must be short and tidy.

Hair Colour/Hairstyles

The colouring of parts of the hair e.g. where there is a complete contrast to the main colour is not permitted. Hair colour which is not considered to be natural e.g. blues and purples, are not permitted. It is not permissible for students to have lines, or patterns cut into their hair. Students with long hair must ensure this does not impede their vision, cover their face or provide a health and safety risk.

The Internet

Whilst the internet is an excellent means of communication we ask parents/carers to help us supervise the use of social internet sites from home.

Equipment for School

Students are expected to have two black, one purple and one green pen, pencil, ruler and rubber. They also need a scientific calculator. Bags should be big enough to hold A4 size books and files.

The Learning Journal

All students are to be provided with a Learning Journal and are expected to have it with them each day. Regular monitoring takes place to ensure students are using their journals correctly. The learning journal is an excellent means of communication between home and college and we encourage parents/carers to use it as a means of tracking their child's progress.

Electronic Equipment

Students are not permitted to use electronic equipment e.g. mobile phones and iPods during the college day. If a student is found to be using electronic equipment it will be confiscated and returned at the end of the day. Persistent offenders will have their equipment confiscated and it will only be returned once parents/carers have made an appointment to meet with the relevant Head of Year. Students are strongly discouraged from bringing costly items to the college and do so on the understanding that the college does not accept any responsibility if this item is lost, stolen or damaged.

Health & Wellbeing

The college promotes a healthy lifestyle for all and as such it is a smoke free environment. Carbonated drinks, energy drinks, crisps, chocolate and chewing-gum are not permitted. All students must bring a refillable water bottle each day.

Bikes/scooters

All bikes and scooters should be stored in the allocated bike shed and secured with the owners own locking device. The college does not accept any responsibility if this item is lost, stolen or damaged. Students must not ride whilst on the college site. The use of helmets is strongly encouraged.

PE Kit

The PE kit has been designed to cater for the broad range of sporting activities that take place in our PE lessons. Students are informed in advance of their PE lesson which items of the PE kit they will require. Only when there is a risk to safety (e.g. frozen playing fields) will activities be re-located to an indoor venue.

Boys Compulsory Kit

- Polo Shirt Purple and white with the Corpus Christi badge for indoor lessons and summer term outdoor lessons.
- **Rugby Shirt** Black with purple trim for outdoor lessons.
- Shorts Black with white trim and drawstring waist.
- Football Socks Plain black.
- **Trainers** Suitable for sport e.g. appropriate grip and ankle support. Fashion trainers are not permitted.
- Football Boots

Boys Optional Kit Items for Outdoor Activities

- **Jogging Bottoms** Plain black with the Corpus Christi badge.
- Skins To be worn under the shirt or shorts for lessons.
- **Training Top** Quarter zip top with the Corpus Christi badge.

Girls Compulsory Kit

- **Polo Shirt** Purple and white with the Corpus Christi badge for indoor lessons and summer term outdoor lessons.
- Rugby Shirt Black with purple trim for outdoor lessons.
- **Shorts** Black with white trim and drawstring waist.
- Football socks Plain black.
- Trainers Suitable for sport e.g. appropriate grip and ankle support. Fashion trainers are not permitted.
- Football Boots

Girls Optional Items for Outdoor Lessons

- Jogging Bottoms Plain black with the Corpus Christi badge.
- Skins To be worn under the shirt or shorts for lessons.
- **Training Top** Quarter zip top with the Corpus Christi badge.
- Black Corpus Leggings.

Kit Policy

Your child is expected to bring their PE kit to every lesson. If your child is unable to take part in their PE lesson due to medical reasons please provide a note via the Learning Journal.

Please label all PE kit clearly with your child's name. Any kit that is lost will need to be replaced.

All PE kit can be bought from Rawcliffes and Jo Brand School Uniform Shop.



Attendance and Punctuality

At Corpus Christi Catholic College we encourage and support our students to achieve 100% attendance.

Good attendance and punctuality is central to students' academic achievements and personal development.

Cashless Catering and online payments

The college is now cashless and operates a cashless catering sytem for the purchase of food from the dining room.

Your child will either be fingerprinted, or given a pin number on their first day to enable them to credit their account. A secure online cashless payment system called SCOPAY is used by the College to make online catering payments and any other payments required for goods, events or trips.

If your child is on Free School Meals the cost of the set meal will be credited to your child's account each day. If your child brings sandwiches and does not use their Free School Meal allocation it will be withdrawn and replaced the following day. Students receiving a Free School Meal must still deposit money into their account if they wish to make any other purchases. You will receive information on the biometric system and ways to pay online in September.
