Each book on the shelf is selected by our teachers to inspire and engage the children as well as supporting our focus on the character traits of kindness, bravery, citizenship, integrity, curiosity and gratitude. PARENTS' EVENINGS

We are holding Parents' Evenings on **Tuesday 7**th and **Wednesday 8th October**.

These meetings will be predominantly pastoral in nature and are an early opportunity for you to have a focused conversation with your child's Class Teacher. We place huge value on the parent/teacher relationships and the positive impact this has in all areas of the development of our children.

The appointments will be 10-minutes and during the meeting, your child's Class Teacher will want to hear your own perceptions of how your child has settled into their new class and then share their own thoughts on this as well as some next steps and how you can support your child with their learning at home.

To book an appointment, open the MCAS App and select Parents' Evening (left-hand side), select your Class Teacher and then select a date and time. The Parents' Evening booking feature will go live on the App on **Tuesday 23**rd **September at 7pm**.

If you have any problems booking an appointment, please get in touch with the school office. If you are unable to make any of the offered times, please don't worry, just email the school office with your availability so we can make an alternative arrangement with your child's Class Teacher.

Uniform

Should your child return home with an item of clothing that does not belong to them, we would appreciate you returning this to the Class Teacher and we can make sure it finds its way back to its owner.

Please could we ask that Pre-School and Reception parents/carers provide a bag with spare clothes in that can stay in school during the week. The children have their own box in the cloakroom where this can be kept. Should we need to use the clothes we will send them home to be replaced. Thank you for your support.
