SPRING BOOKSHELVES

Reading is without a doubt the most important academic skill we can teach our children. But what is also important, is developing a love for books and for reading – something we try and instil in our children throughout their time at Crown Street Primary!

Books are incredible tools for learning about everything which is why we hold books at the heart of our curriculum. As we have previously mentioned we use books like windows and mirrors; a window to another world (real or fantasy) and a mirror for seeing ourselves and/or our qualities within a story.

Each term, the Class Teachers and myself (as you know I cannot help myself when talking about and/or looking at books!) choose a selection of books for the upcoming term which feature on their Curriculum Bookshelf. These books help to bring depth and a further understanding to our character traits along with being stimuli for the different learning planned for the upcoming term. Having different books each term allows us to explore a wide range of books including exploring different genres and authors, all whilst being used to inspire, engage and spark curiosity. We are excited to read and share these books throughout the term.


CROWN STREET COMMUNITY (continued)
