<p>Observational Drawing</p>  <p>How to Draw Spring Flowers</p> <p>Draw some Spring flowers, you can use this video to help or find some outside.</p> <p>What shapes can you see? Do you know the name of these Spring flowers? Can you label your picture?</p>	<p>Art Challenge</p> <p>This term, we will be learning about the artist Gustav Klimt. Can you create some artwork inspired by his paintings of nature?</p> <p>Maybe you could do your own 'Tree of Life'.</p> 	<p>Food Tasting</p> <p>Can you try a food you have never tasted before?</p> <p>Upload a picture to tapestry and tell us what it smelt, tasted like and if you enjoyed it.</p>
