Communication with Parents

Communication within the Team

Pupils are discussed regularly, targets set and shared to ensure consistency of approach. Weekly team meetings facilitate team work and sharing of good practice.

Social Communication

Developing social skills through familiar games, turn taking, choosing who is next.

Choice Making

Opportunities to make choices throughout the daily routine, e.g. toys, food, drink, who to play with, to promote independence.

Integrated Speech and Language therapy

SALT works within the class as well as 1:1 to promote communication and set targets to work on in class and therapy sessions.

Structured Play

Pupils are supported to direct their own play using their own method of communication.

Role Play is an important part of early communication. Pupils are encouraged to observe their peers during play and copy their actions.

Use of technology

Collaborative approach between OT, Physio and SALT to ensure pupils have optimal access to technology to support development of communication.
