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Your tutor

- Tutor is key contact
- Main source of guidance and support
 - academic and non-academic matters
- Close working relationship
- Daily contact
- Liaison with subject teachers
- Liaison with Head of Year and Head of Sixth Form
- Conducts regular interviews
- Contributes to UCAS and general references



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Student progress

- Regular student/tutor interviews
 - purpose and content (academic and extra-curricular)
- Regular target-setting with tutors and teachers
- Regular written reviews
- Liaison with subject areas – positive and negative (referral system – but positive referrals and the All Stars reward system)
- Helping “off-track” students – guidance, support, advice

<p>Boys & Girls Accessories</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 1 pair of stud earrings • 1 ring • A watch <p>Not Dress Code</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 'Alternative' piercings such as nose studs / rings • 'Expander' earrings 	<p>Boys & Girls Hairstyles</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Neat, sensible hairstyles. • No 'extremes of fashion' hairstyles. • Natural hair colour only.

Breach procedure:

1. Verbal warning and sticker in planner
2. Written warning and alternative clothing
3. Sent home
4. Meeting with parents
5. Continual defiance dealt with severely

Attendance

- Absence
 - Must pre-authorise (by phone)
 - Holiday requests via letter to Mr Foster
 - Medical appointments out of school hours, where possible. Must be evidenced
 - Return to school form must be completed
- Unauthorised absences
 - Issued on Friday
 - Your responsibility to authorise
 - If cannot be authorised then an hour's after-school detention
- Attendance breakfast every half term



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Punctuality

- Closely monitored
- Late if not in form **by 8.45**
- Same day lunchtime detention if late
- Punctuality group for persistent lateness
 - Monitored by HoY
 - make up missed time after school on Friday
