University Year 12 Study Days

University College, Oxford have a programme of Year 12 subject study days taking place in the spring and summer Terms. These are planned as follows:

- English and History Study Day Friday 21 February (applications now open)

*Please note, our Politics, Law and History Study Day is specifically for Year 12 students from the UK of Black African, Caribbean or of Mixed Heritage of either Black African or Caribbean heritage.

- The application processes run separately for each subject-based study day.
- Students attend the day individually.
- To apply students must submit an application and a teacher from their school must support this by submitting a teachers' approval form. Please see more details about Univ's 2020 Year 12 study days, along with provisional programmes and links to the application forms on Univ's website.
- Please note: Help towards travel expenses for these days may be available for some students who otherwise would not be able to attend. This is allocated on a case-by-case basis, for example for students eligible for free school meals.

UNIQ Residentials – Spring or Summer

The UNIQ Residentials are a fantastic way for Year 12 students come to Oxford for five days, stay in a college, attend an academic programme and take part in social activities in the evenings – all for free. Students will get first-hand experience of life at university, meet like-minded people and gain deeper understanding of a subject that interests them.

Academic Programme

During UNIQ students will be taught by Oxford academics, attend lectures and labs, and use departmental facilities – just like a real undergraduate! In addition to lectures students might be asked to prepare some independent work for a tutorial at the end of the week where they will go through the topic in detail, either individually with a tutor or in a small group.

The UNIQ academic programmes are demanding, but they are also fun; students can look at their favourite subject in new and engaging ways. The UNIQ courses give students an insight into what studying at degree level, and at Oxford, is really like.

We run courses on over 30 subjects, so there's plenty to choose from and almost certainly something to suit a variety of interests. Have a look at the courses page for more information.

We understand that aiming high and applying to top universities like Oxford can seem a little daunting. There will be a range of dedicated sessions throughout the week providing information on every aspect of the application process.

Philosophy Plus Science Taster Day

Friday 10 January 2020

What is chaos? What is infinity? Can machines think? The links between Science and Philosophy are broad and deep, extending well beyond the obvious overlaps in logic, artificial intelligence, and ethics. Some of the greatest philosophers of the past - from Aristotle to Newton - are now known as scientists. Sir Isaac Newton's book, *Philosophiae naturalis principia mathematica* (Mathematical Principles of Natural Philosophy), outlines this everlasting relationship between science and philosophy which can still be seen today.

This taster day provides an opportunity to find out more about how science and philosophy intertwine. More specifically, how Computer Science, Physics, and Mathematics all have one thing in common: Philosophy. This event is an opportunity for students who are considering applying for a joint degree in these subjects, and want to find out more.

This event is open to high-achieving year 11 and 12 students from UK schools. (Year 13 students taking a gap year, who will be applying for 2021 university admission are also welcome.) Students should be taking, or planning on taking Maths A-level (or equivalent), and expect to receive at least an A grade in it. Students taking Further Maths A-level are particularly welcome, as are those taking Physics A-level. Attendees should be considering applying to university.
