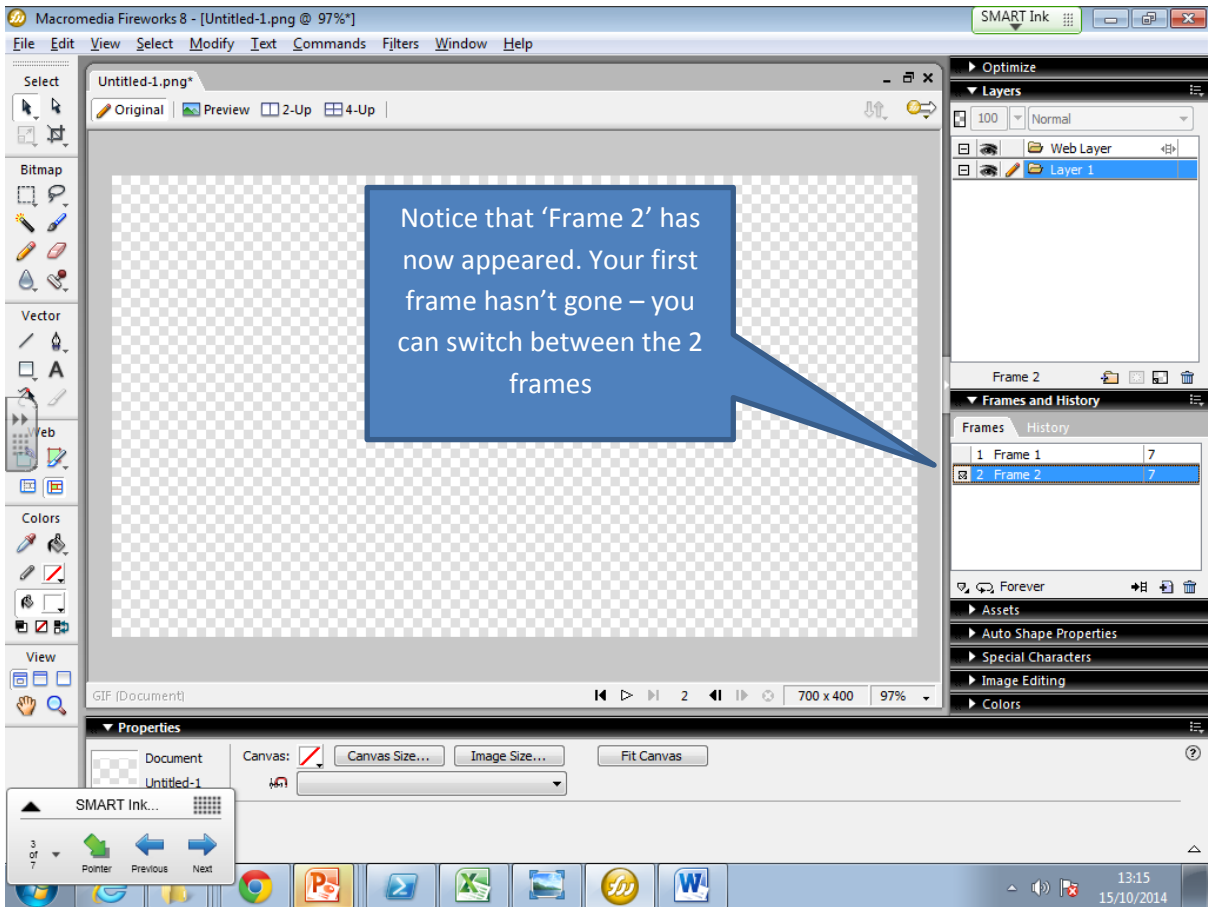




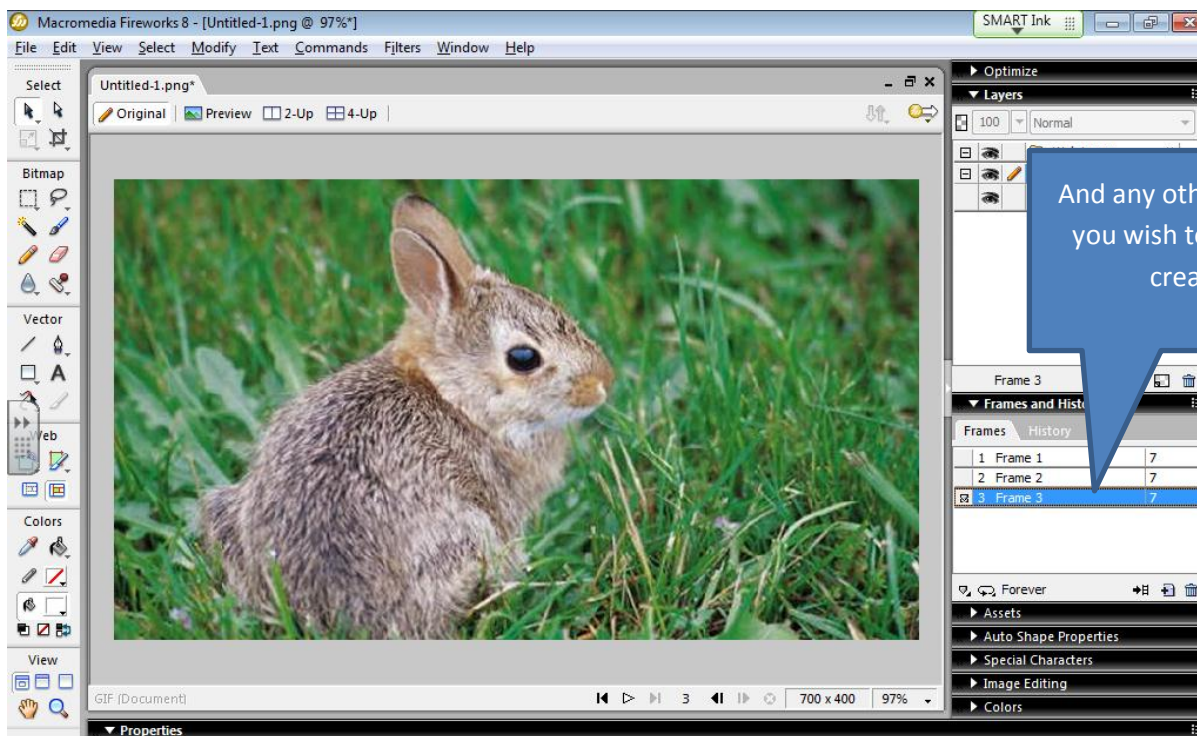
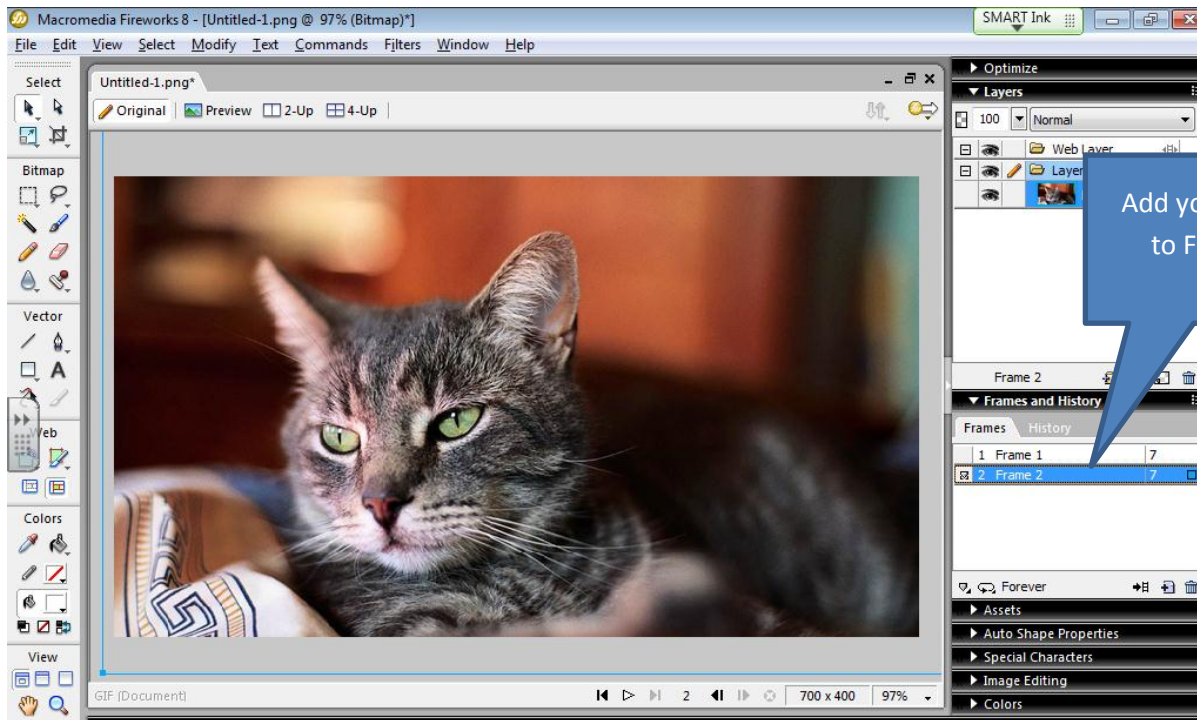


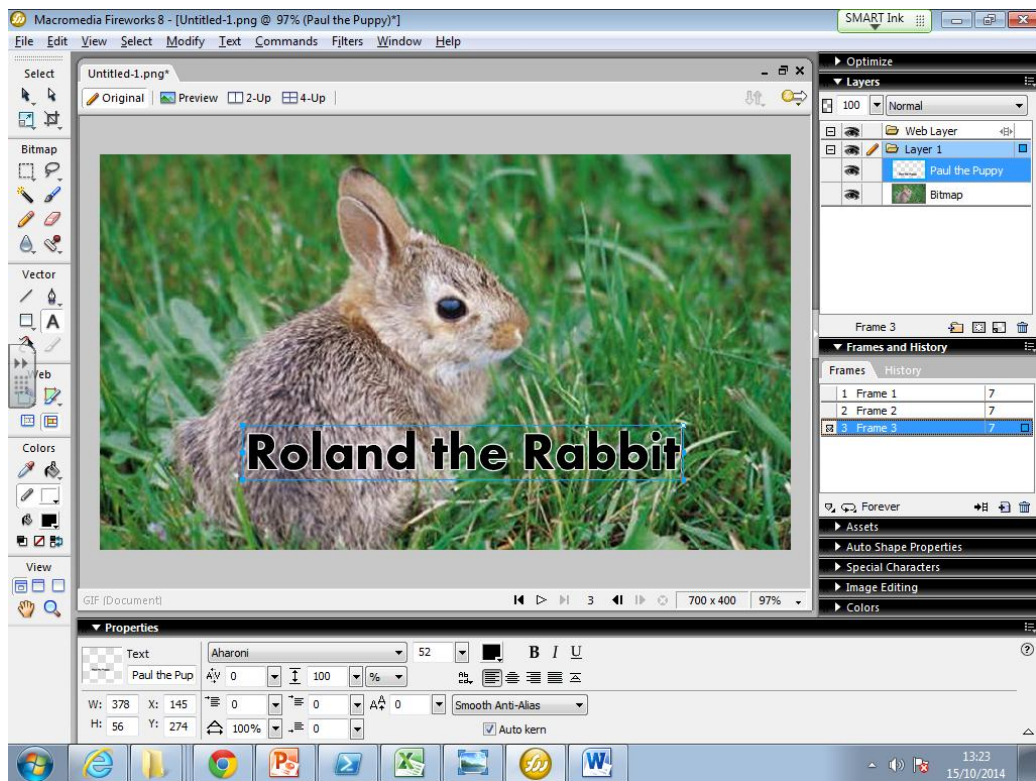
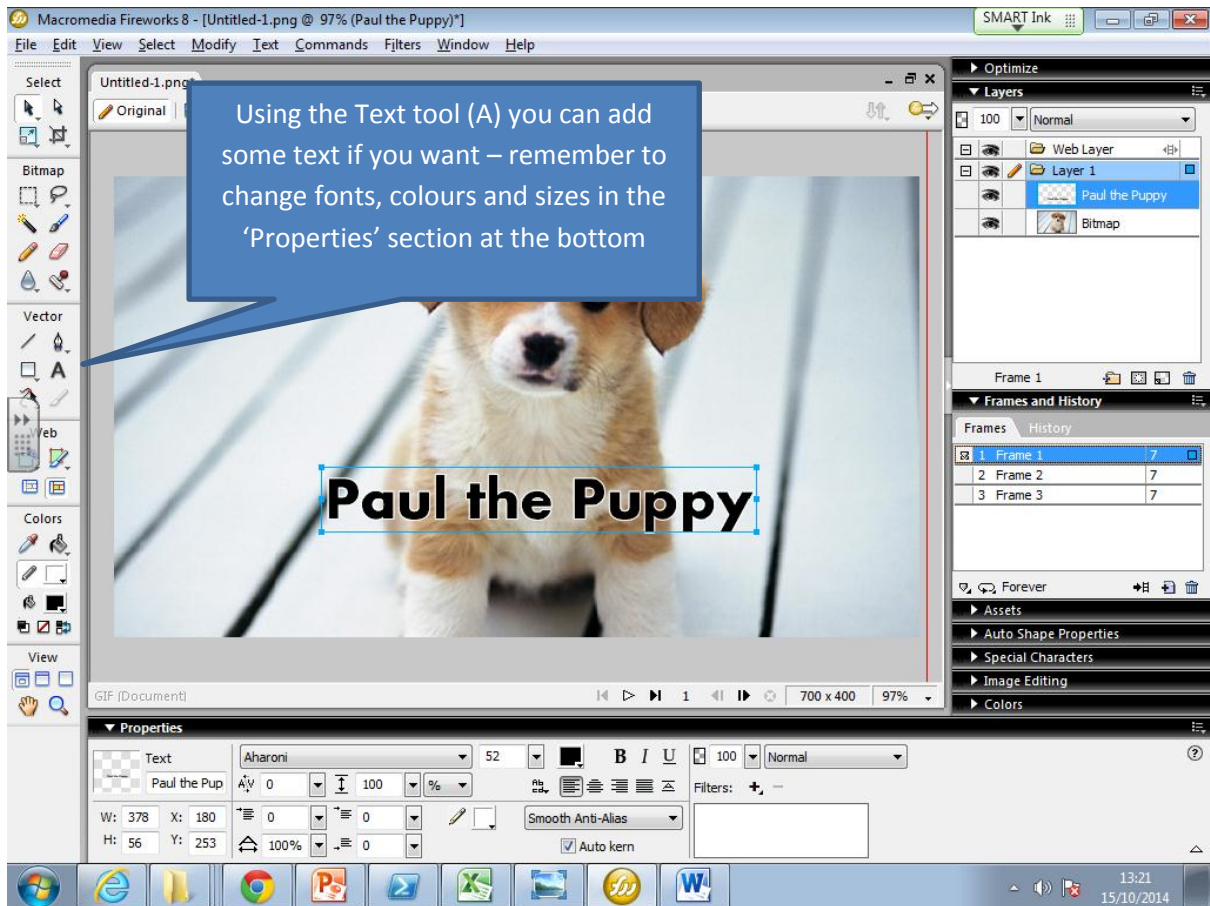
To create an animation, we need to make new 'frames'. We can manage these in this panel on the right to the screen

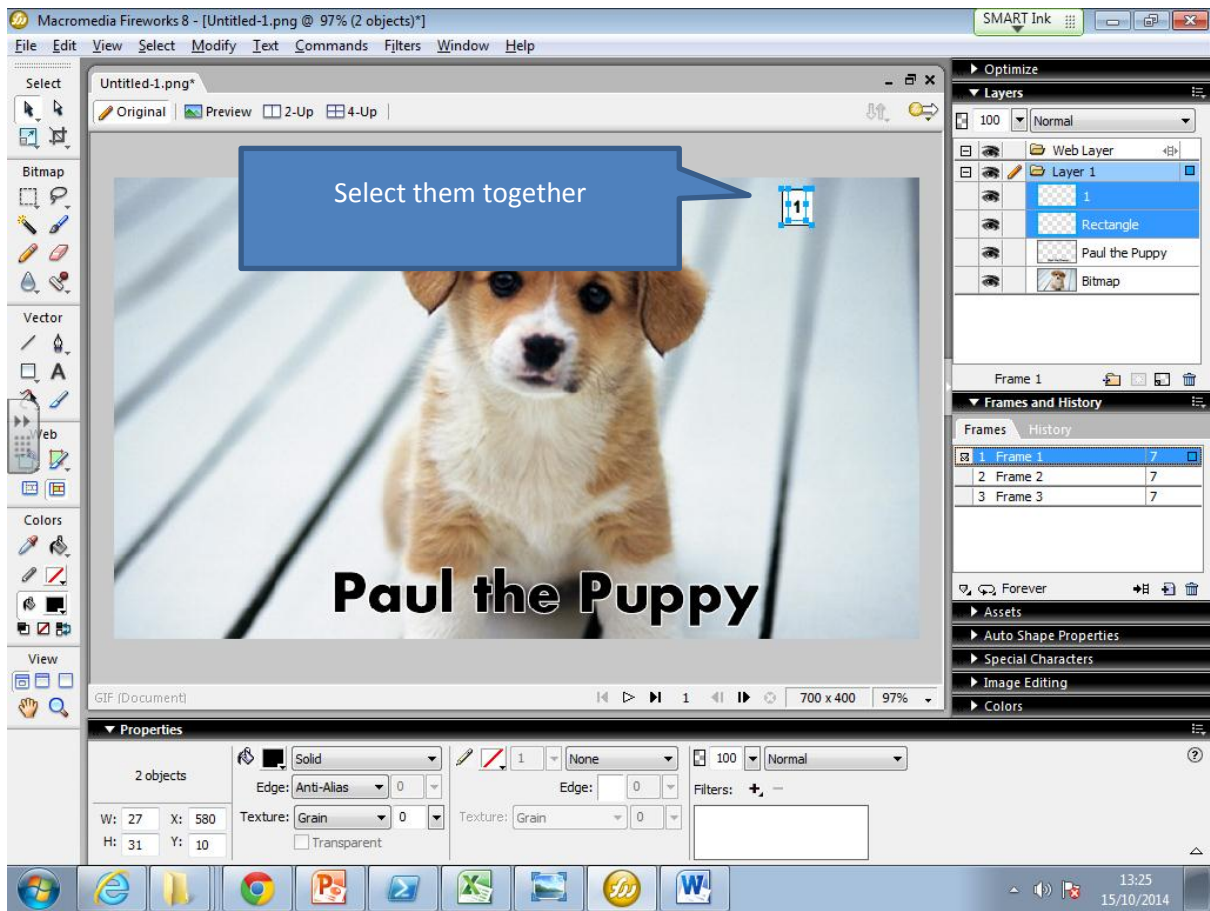
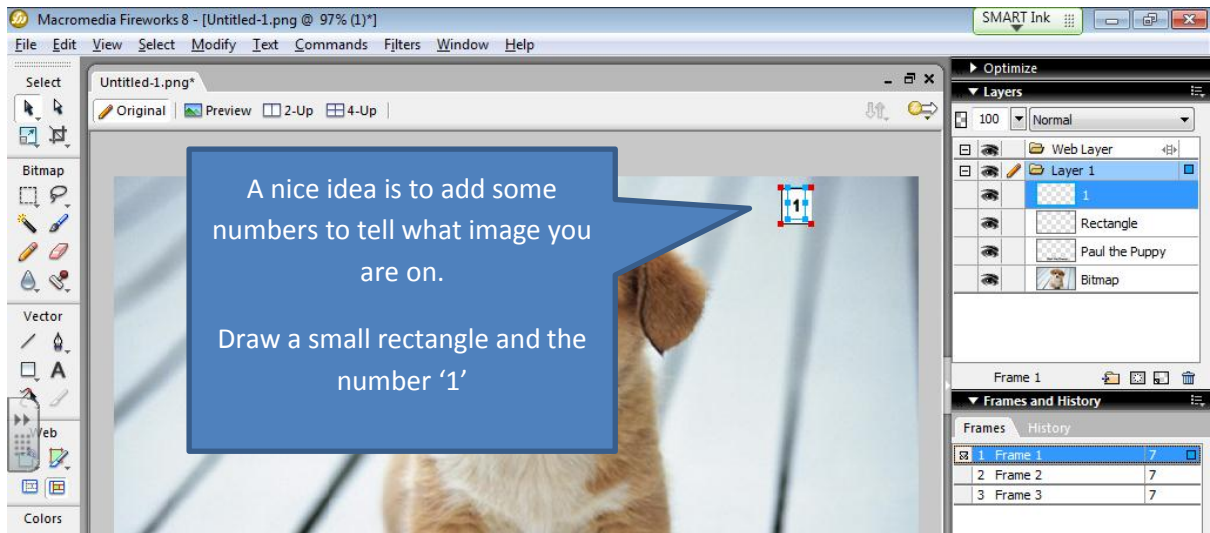
Now add a new frame by clicking the +

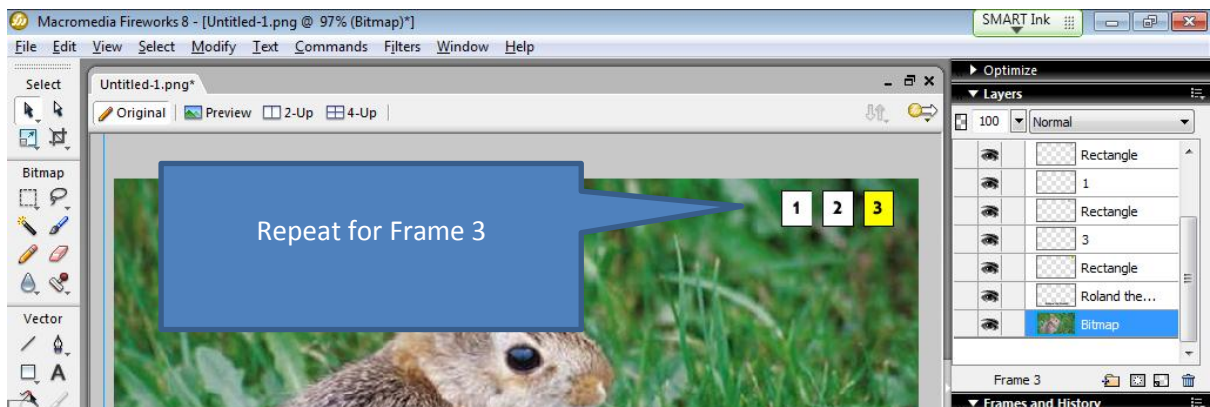
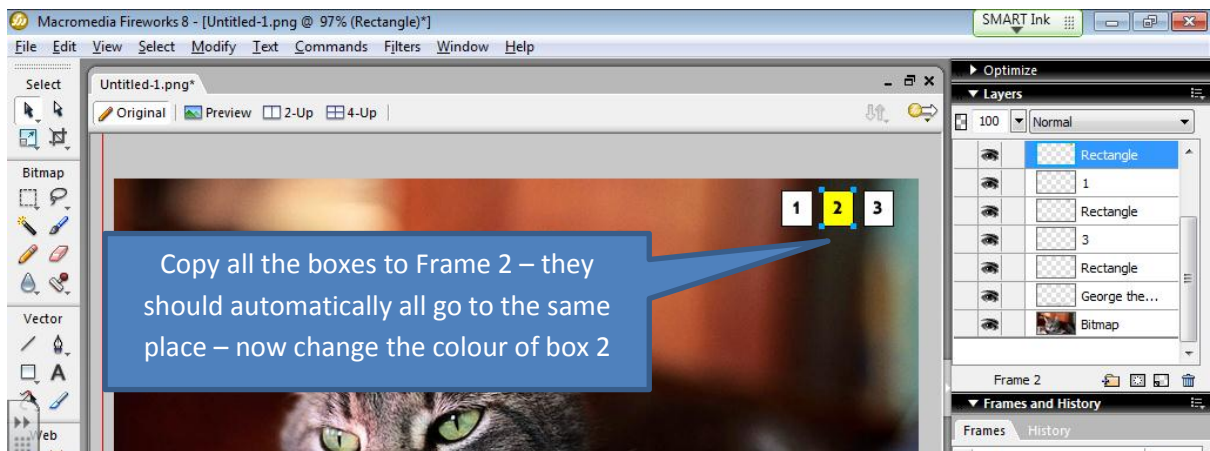
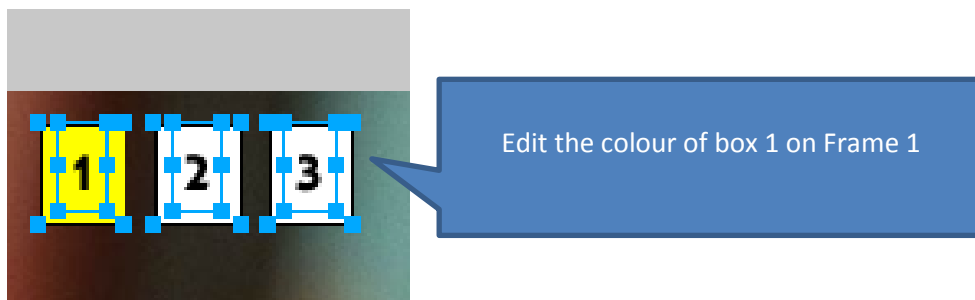
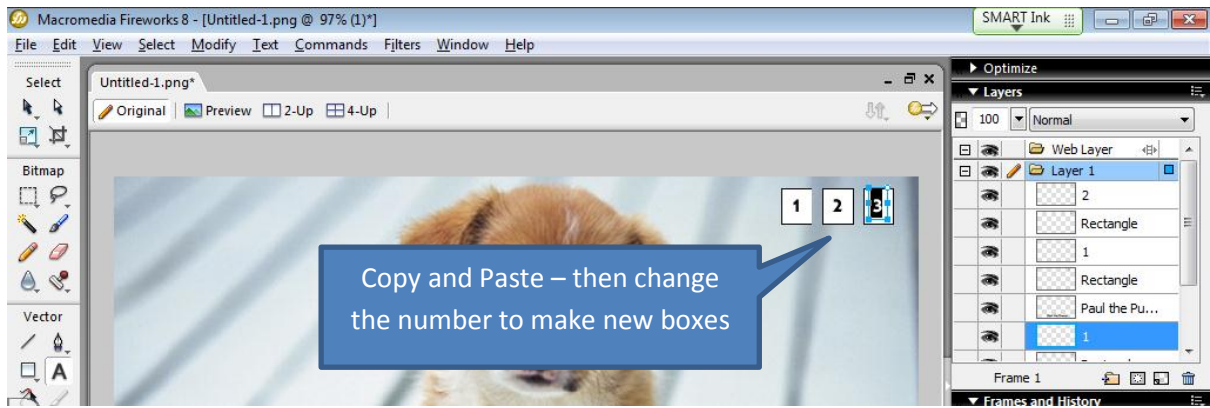


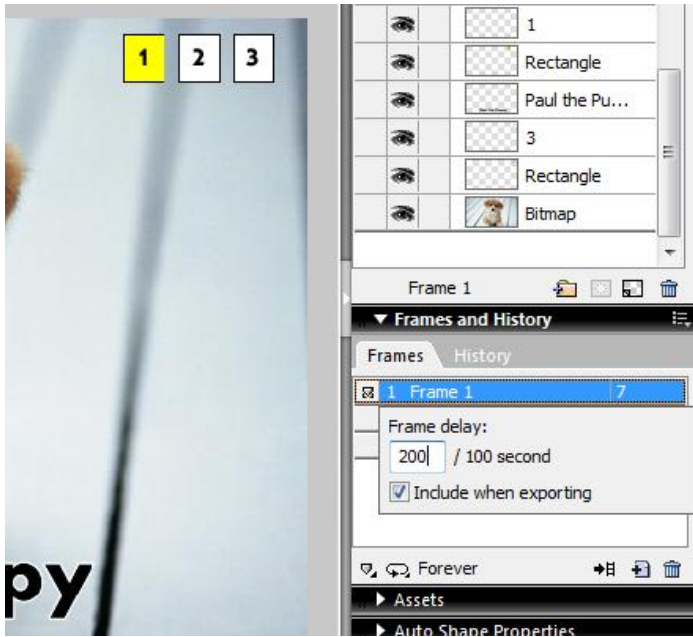
Notice that 'Frame 2' has now appeared. Your first frame hasn't gone – you can switch between the 2 frames





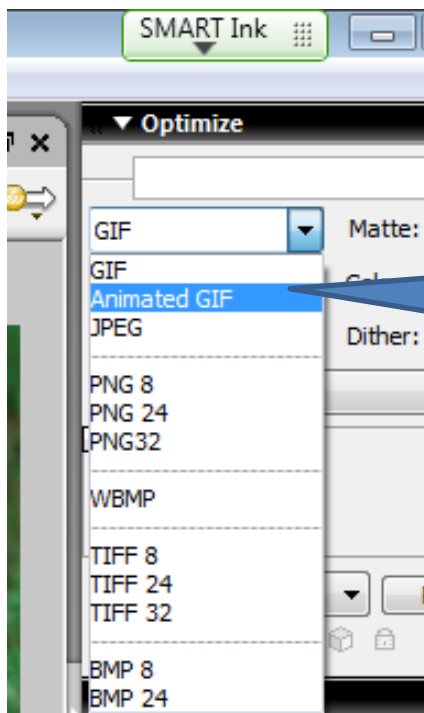
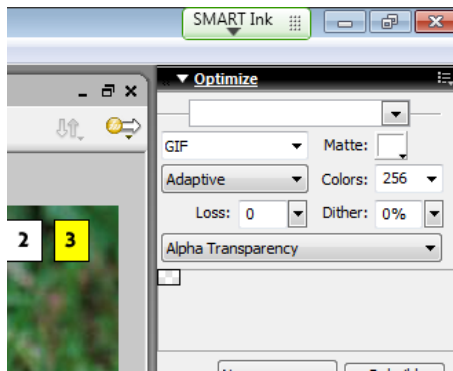




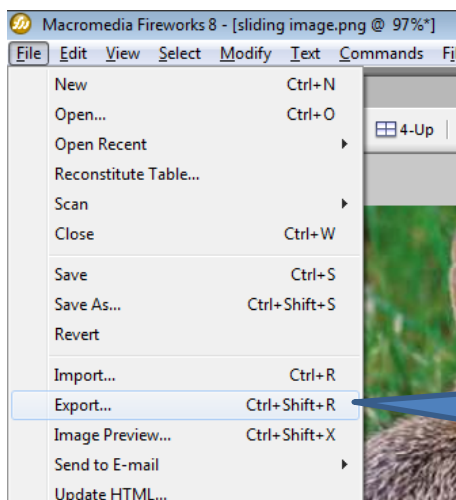


'7' is the speed of the animation. You can make the animation run slower by clicking on this figure and changing it to 200 – do this for all frames

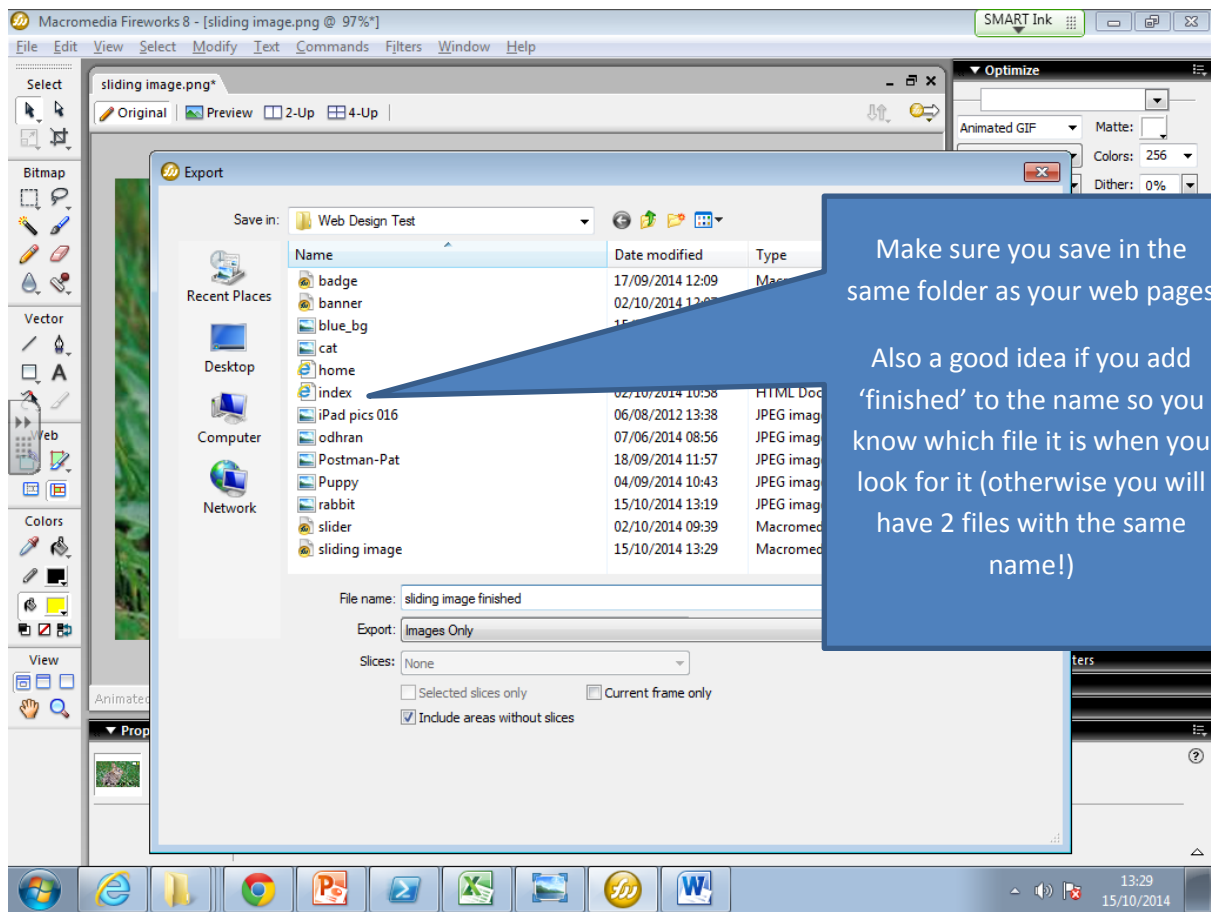
Saving the Final Animation



In the 'Optimize' panel, change GIF to Animated GIF as shown



Now go to File > Export
