What is the focus of this bridging course?

- Students will examine the impact of public health practices with specific focus on the global pandemic.

	• Students will begin to develop an overview of health and social care careers and the entry requirements for key roles.
	• Students will develop an understanding of the knowledge, skills, roles and responsibilities of key professionals within the sector.
	Students will create a fact file based on one specific health or social care career pathway.

	Students will learn about factors that impact upon an individual's emotional development.
	Students will explore the concept of 'self' and emotional development through the life stages.
	 Students will be introduced to the theories of attachment that includes the work of Bowlby Schaffer and Emmerson.
	 Students will then apply their knowledge through providing responses to questions based on a case study of an individual.

	 Students will be introduced to skills and attributes of effective communication in healthcare professionals.
	Students will explore the theoretical principles of Argyle (1972) communication cycle.
	• Students will review and evaluate a range of strategies adapted by the health and social care services to overcome barriers to communication.
	 Students will write a short report on a service user with a communication barrier and provide examples on how professionals in a care setting can overcome this barrier.

	 Student will explore the aims of Public Health in the UK and globally.
	Students will consider methods to prevent and control communicable diseases.
	 Students will research the role of the World Health Organisation and its recent contribution in the Covid-19 pandemic.
	 Students will create a PPT presentation (or a similar presentation tool) on their research findings.
