

Overview of Bridging Course

What is the focus of this bridging course?

- Students will be introduced to the Early Years Foundation Stage.
- Students will be introduced to the general principles of growth and development and factors that can influence development from birth to early childhood.
- Students will consider the role of speech, communication and language in child development.
- Students will be introduced to the importance of play and learning to promote cognitive, social, emotional and physical development in early childhood.

w/b 27 April	Overview of what students will cover this week:
	 Students will learn about the principles of growth and development and how they are measured, in children aged 0-2 years. Students will be introduced to the concept of atypical growth and development. Students will learn about the impact of biological, genetic and lifestyle factors that affect growth and development. Students will apply their learning by responding to questions in the provided case study.
w/b 4 May	 Students will be introduced to the concept of play and learning in early years settings. Students will learn about play types and play opportunities that are provided within an early years setting. Students will be introduced to the Forrest School curriculum approach and the influences of outdoor play in early year's settings. Students will apply their learning by creating a PPT presentation (or similar presentation material) on play and learning in an early years setting.
w/b 11 May	 Students will be introduced the role of speech, communication and language in child development. Students will be introduced to the concept of language acquisition and the theoretical principles of Noah Chomsky. Students will identify activities in an early years setting that support and enhance communication, language and speech. Students will apply their learning by presenting a short report on how children acquire speech, communication and language skills.
w/b 18 May	 Students will learn about the principles, themes and aims of the Early Years Foundation Stage. Students will learn about the role of the 'key worker' and explore partnership working with parents in the Early Years setting. Students will explore how settings are responsible to keep children safe. Students will apply their learning and produce an information booklet for prospective parents to explain the broad principles and aims of an Early Years Setting.
