

Overview of Bridging Course

Department: History

What is the focus of this bridging course?

- Students will be introduced to Britain topic (1906-1957)
- Students will be introduced to the Germany topic (1871-1991)
- Students will develop key knowledge on Prime Ministers and political parties during the period 1906-1957 to help them understand the political background to this unit
- Students will develop an understanding of the key stages of Germany throughout this unit looking at the Kaiserreich, impact of WWI and WWII and the Cold War.
- Students will develop their understanding of the Cold War to help with their background knowledge for this Germany topic.

	 Begin to gain an understanding of the content of the A-Level course and the different elements
	 Students will then first look at the Britain topic and begin to gain an understanding of where the course begins in 1906 and what Britain was like at this time.
	• Students will then study the different political parties within Britain who dominate this period of History.
	Students will produce a short written piece on the context of Britain in the early 1900s.

	 Students will begin to develop key knowledge of Prime Ministers throughout this whole course which will support their study next year.
	 Students will focus on the rise and fall of political parties during the course and think about possible causes and reasons for this.
	Students will plot the rise of the Labour party and the impact of this

	 Students will begin to develop their understanding of the beginning of the Germany unit and begin to understand unification and its impact on the early period of the course.
	 Students will create a key timeline of key events they believe are important in the 1871- 1991 period of German History
	 Students will develop their understanding of the German political system and its changes over time.
	Students will answer some key questions on the Germany course
w/b 18 May	Students will begin to develop their understanding of the Cold War to develop their
	background knowledge ready for the 1945-1991 period of the Germany unit.
	 They will need to develop understanding of the key figures and countries involved.
	Students will study the impact of the Cold War on Germany and Berlin.
