

## **Overview of Bridging Course**

Department: English Language

## What is the focus of this bridging course?

- In this course students will be introduced to some key concepts and ideas which underpin the study of English Language at A Level
- They will learn about different attitudes to language and how these can be categorised.
- They will look at the role of dictionaries and lexicographers in shaping attitudes to language and language change.
- They will look at some forms of linguistic prejudice, such as accentism.
- They will explore the relationship between language and gender, and how gender intersects with ideas about accent, to develop their understanding of why linguistic prejudice exists.
- They will learn about how to investigate language and will complete their own mini language investigation.

	They will look at how and why language change appears in the news.
	They will look at the work of lexicographers and debates surrounding their work.
	<ul> <li>They will look at the role of dictionaries and debates surrounding their purpose.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>They will look at socio-historical influences on language – for example, how has the Covid 19 Pandemic changed how we use language?</li> </ul>
	Students will write an essay on this topic

	<ul> <li>Students will further explore the relationship between language and society and will be introduced to the topics of language and gender and accent and dialect.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>They will study accentism and debates surrounding this.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>They will look at some debates to do with language and gender.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>They will look at the relationship between accent and gender.</li> </ul>
w/b 18 May	<ul> <li>Students will be introduced to the idea of investigating language, in particular, to attitudinal studies.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>They will carry out their own mini language investigation on either attitudes to emoji</li> </ul>
	use or attitudes to taboo language.
	They will document their findings.
