	 Students will be introduced to their first practitioner: Bertolt Brecht, in detail and take
	part in activities that helps them to recap and recall information about this style of theatre and acting.
	 Students will learn about the importance of seeing a wide range of live theatre and how
	that benefits elements of each component of the course.

	students to begin to form opinions and make evaluative judgments as an audience
	member.

	about theatre. They will take part in activities that helps to explore characterisation

	will help with ideas within the devising process in Year 12.
