About the tasks

Task 1

How health care services work together to meet the needs of a specified individual

Produce a report on how different health care services work together to meet the needs of the user.

Your report must include:

- how one health care service could meet the specific health needs of the specified individual.
- how a second health care service could meet the specific health needs of the specified individual.
- how these care services could work together to meet the specific health care needs of the specified individual.

Your report must be based on the individual provided by the exam board.

This is called multidisciplinary team work.

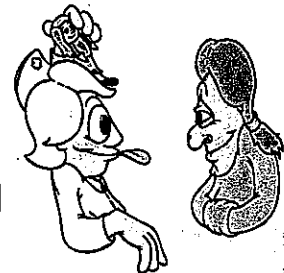
Top tips for this task

- ✓ Look carefully at the age and health condition of the individual in your case study and make sure that you focus on them.
- ✓ Avoid making general points which are not focussed on the individual in your case study.
- ✓ Think hard about how the health care services you are including can meet the needs of your individual. What will they do? What will they provide?
- ✓ Remember to think carefully about teamwork and how the different health care services will work together to meet the needs of the individual.

Task 2

How social care services meet the needs of an individual

Produce a report on how social care services can meet the needs of the user.



Your report must include:

- how social care services could meet the specific needs of the specified individual.
- how voluntary care services could meet the specific needs of the specified individual.
- how informal care options could meet the specific needs of the specified individual.

Top tips for this task

- ✓ Really focus on the needs of your individual — be specific. What needs do they have because of their circumstances and condition?
- ✓ Remember to include voluntary care and informal care too.

Your report must be based on the individual provided by the exam board.

Health Conditions

Type 2 diabetes

When the body's cells don't respond properly to insulin. This can cause the blood sugar level to rise to a dangerous level. It can lead to symptoms such as permanent damage to sight.



Additional Needs

These include sensory impairments (e.g. hearing difficulties), physical impairments and learning disabilities.

Cardiovascular Conditions

These affect the heart or blood vessels — e.g. coronary heart disease and cerebral vascular accident.



Obesity

When someone is very overweight with a lot of body fat. For most adults, a BMI of 30 to 39.9 is classed as obese.

Respiratory Conditions

These are conditions which affect the lungs and the ability to breathe — e.g. asthma and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD).

Arthritis

Causes pain and inflammation in the joints — e.g. osteoarthritis and rheumatoid arthritis.

Dementia

A gradual decline of brain function. This affects cognitive skills and development. There are many different types and causes of dementia.

Barriers to Accessing Services

Physical: Features of the physical environment which make it difficult to access services — e.g. inaccessible buildings, toilets and doorways.

Sensory Disability: A disability with one of the senses — sight, sound, smell, touch and taste.



Financial: Some services need to be paid for — e.g. the cost of prescriptions and dental check-ups.

English as an Additional Language: Where English is not an individual's first language. These people may find reading, speaking or understanding English difficult.

Social Background: This refers to a person's upbringing and their position in society.

Cultural Background: This refers to the groups or communities a person belongs to based on factors such as their race, religion, sexual orientation and gender.

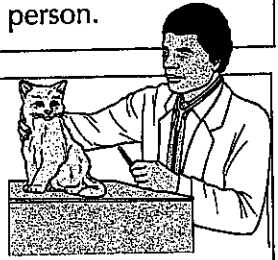
Language or Speech Impediments: Difficulties in speaking or understanding speech.

Geographical: Living too far away from services, or with limited access to suitable transport.

Text: Cover a range of ways in which information itself can be inaccessible to people with learning disabilities — e.g. written health advice in a hard-to-read format.
