RE: Year 13 Home Study

I hope this letter finds you well.

As we come towards the penultimate half term for our Year 13 students, we always review study arrangements in order to provide students with the best possible support and guidance in their exam preparations. As such, we would like to grant selected students home study from **Monday February 26th 2024**.

If a student has been granted home study, they are still expected to attend school from 8.40 am as normal, and attend all lessons and independent study periods as normal until their last teaching lesson of the school day. When students have completed their last lesson of the day, they would be free to leave the school site via the school reception to study at home. For example, if a student only had lessons during Period 3 and Period 4 of a school day, we would still expect the student to be present for registration at 8.40 am and stay on school site until the end of their last lesson at 2.10 pm. Students are more than welcome to stay on school site longer than their last lesson of the day if they would like to study in our facilities in school. The Sixth Form Area is open for students to use until 5.30 pm each day.

For the home study system to work correctly and to keep all students safe and accounted for throughout the school day, students must swipe in and out when they enter/exit the school building. When students leave for home study, it is expected that the students swipe out and then leave via the student reception (unless it is lunchtime and the Sixth Form entrance is open).

Students who do not follow these conditions of home study will have the privilege of home study revoked.

Students have been informed via Mrs Francis, Head of Year 13, by the end of Friday February 16th if they have been or have not been granted home study.

Selected students have not been granted home study as we wish to provide them with more intensive support on the school site to help them achieve their academic potential. If a student is not granted home study and leaves the school site without permission, they will have been considered to have truanted a school session and will be sanctioned as such.
